Yet exidently, according to survey results,

enthod. Last year the Interfraternity Council
made a beginning. A set of proposals were
adopted which limit Hell Week to five days
during the last week in February, public acts
are restricted to campus and houses, two-hour
study periods each night are required, distinct
steps are to be taken to prevent mis-conduct of
pledges in the classroom, and nightly inspections
by council officers are to be made of all fraternity houses.

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

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
