A leading cause of death to persons between the ages of fifteen and forty-five, tuberculosis still menaces the lives of all United States citizens. It is this slowacting, secretive enemy tat the national association is working against. Each person who busy seals may be particularly benefited, or at least find his money put to use locally. In the localities in which the scals are purchased, 95 per cent of the money is expended in anti-tuberculosis work.

Several faculty members and some students have criticized the recent issue of the Wildean in which certain members of the University fac-ulty were "graded." One of the most frequent arguments against the article in question was that fellow instructors are much abler critics

Although the criticisms contained in the magazine may not have been completely valid, it is Tim Krrsvit's belief that they were infinitely more penetrating than ones which might have come from other faculty members. Certainly, they were of greater value to students.

A fellow instructor may know much about a professor's habits, likes, dislikes, and knowledge of a subject. But the student who sits in the professor's class day after day is apt to know more about the man's delivery or presentation of the subject. Too, the student can gain a comparatively authentic picture of the instructor's knowledge of his subject from the method of presentation.
