



ADY KATS CAPTURE 19

Last season's basketball theme, "We've got a new attitude", proved to be an appropriate phrase for the Lady Kats as they ended their season with a three-game sweep of the National

Women's Invitational Tournament in Amarillo, Texas.

Third-year coach Sharon Fanning's squad posted a 23-8 record, edged into the Top 25 poll and won two tournament titles. The squad's NWIT victory put the cap on Fanning's first winning season since coming to Kentucky, and also matched the victories of the 1982-83 Lady Kats team that featured the likes of All-American Valerie Still, Patty Jo Hedges and Lea Wise.


The city of Amarillo opened its arms to the field of eight teams: No. 1 seed Kentucky, Fresno State, North Carolina-Charlotte, Maine, Miami (Fla.), Illinois State, Toledo and Wyoming.

Game One matched the Lady Kats against North
Atlantic Conference champion Maine, which entered the
tournament seeded eighth. Kentucky's offensive attack from
guards Kristi Cushenberry and Tracye Davis, who
contributed 18 points a piece, and forward Vanessa FosterSutton, who added 16 points, overpowered the Black Bears
as Kentucky went on to post its first victory, 76-66.

The Kats faced the University of Miami in a tough second-round game. Miami and Kentucky had met earlier in the season, with Kentucky winning 80-71. With no love lost from the prior game, both teams played physical basketball, but it was scoring from Foster-Sutton (21 points) and Cushenberry (17) that led the Lady Kats to an 80-68

win and an opportunity to capture their first NWIT title.

Entertainment would come not only from the championship game, but from Coach Fanning, the spectators would learn, as she began to feel the rise of excitement with her team's anticipated matchup with Toledo. Calling it a gesture of gratitude to the Amarillo community, Fanning arrived at courtside in a blue Texas-

style leather jacket, white leather pants and Kentucky blue boots, surprising the crowd and her own team.

The real excitment, however, was in the championship game, which pitted top-seeded Kentucky against Toledo.

The Lady Rockets, in pursuit of their first NWIT

Mia Daniel shown. championship after finishing third in the NWIT the previous year, almost saw their dream of an NWIT title become reality as they led the Kats 41-33 at halftime. However, the Kats had their own visions of victory. Cushenberry recorded her best performance of the tournament, scoring 20 points, and center Lisa Ellis added 18 points in Kentucky's 85-76 championship win.



The championship was a great finale for Foster-Sutton, who scored in double figures throughout the tournament and was named to the **NWIT All-**Tournament team. Cushenberry also joined Foster-Sutton on the All-NWIT squad, with a total of 55 points in three games.

Lady Kats Look Forward to

Senior Tracye Davis is expected to stand out in her final season.

After capturing the 1990 National Women's Invitational Tournament and their first winning season in three years, the Lady Kats plan to forge ahead in 1991, with hopes of getting a step closer to the national respect the program enjoyed earlier in the decade.

This is considered a year of great expectations for the team, which finished last season at 23-8, edged into the Top 25 basketball poll and won three tournament titles. The Lady Kats, who dominated their nonconference opponents last season, look to improve in the competitive

Southeastern Conference.

"Our intensity, communication. focus and determination must rise to the next level for us to improve on last year's performance, as well as achieve our goals. Our confidence improved and our expectations increased as this past season progressed. Improvement in every aspect of our program is indicative of what hard work and team work can accomplish."

The number of veterans will outnumber the newcomers this year, as the Lady Kats return eight players and welcome six freshmen. Gone are forward Vanessa Foster-Sutton, center Lisa Ellis and guards Malinka Salhi and Kris Miller, who combined for an average of 33 points last season.

Guard Tracye Davis, the squad's only senior, is expected to stand out in her final season. Last year, the 5-8 Davis was fourth on the team in scoring with 10.1 points and added 2.8 rebounds per game. She led in scoring in six games and recorded a career-high 23 points against Louisville and Georgia. She is expected to fill the hole left by Salhi.

"Tracye will play point guard," Fanning said. "She does a great job of seeing the floor and making things happen. She has excellent court sense and really improved on defense as a iunior '

Two starters return—5-9 junior guard Kristi Cushenberry and 5-8 junior

forward Stacy McIntyre. Cushenberry, who led the team in scoring as a freshman, averaged 11.5 points and 2.6 rebounds last season. McIntyre contributed 7.6 points and 4.7 rebounds. McIntyre hit her career high of 17 points against Eastern Kentucky and LSU.

"Kristi is one of the best shooters in the SEC and we are expecting great things from her this season," Fanning said. "Her strength, quickness, range and confidence have improved and she is setting some very impressive goals for her junior year. Stacy is very unselfish and a real leader. We expect Stacy, along with Kristi and Tracye, to see action at the

three position."

Also returning and hoping to see more action will be junior Jamie Hobgood, who averaged 1.8 points a game.

"Jamie is determined to contribute at the one or two position," Fanning said. "Jamie has a great feel for the game and we expect her to make our perimeter positions very competitive."

The sophomore class should provide plenty of depth with the return of 6-foot center Jocelyn Mills, 5-11 forward Mia Daniel, 6-2 forward Pattresa Leonard and 6-0 center/forward Cathy Proctor.

Mills ended her first collegiate season fifth on the team in scoring with an average of 8.6 points and 4.7 rebounds. Mills, who averaged 16.7 minutes per game, was named to the All-SEC freshman honorable mention squad and netted the Lady Kats' Rookie of the Year Award at season's end.

Daniel, who averaged 5.3 points and 67.2 percent from the line, provided depth, as did Leonard (2.9 ppg, 2.6 rpg) and Proctor (2.2 ppg, 2.6

"Mia can score, she can rebound and she is always making things happen," Fanning said. "Jocelyn is the 'Charles Barkley' of our team. She can shoot comfortably outside and has really improved on her ability to drive to the bucket. Pattresa is the 'James Worthy' of our team. She is ready to shoot when she crosses half court and we are really proud of her

progress on the defensive end and as a rebounder. Cathy was definitely the most improved player on last year's team. She is a very smart, strong player that gets great position on defense.

The new additions to the team are 6-1

center Christe Jordan (19 ppg, 12 rpg), 5-7 guard Karen Killen (25 ppg, 6 rpg), 6-3 center/forward Jennifer Gray (13 ppg, 8 rpg), 5-11 guard Tedra Eberhart (16 ppg, 8 rpg), 5-9 guard Kayla Campbell (15 ppg, 9 rpg), 6-2 center/forward Tiundra Love (12 ppg, 10 rpg) and walk-on Rebekah Reasor (7.1, 5.9).

"Again, our freshman class is not one to be taken lightly," Fanning said. "Two of our freshmen were playersof-the-year in their state and played on state championship teams. We must be strong physically and mentally. We must have depth, strong play and improve our quickness to win in the SEC. We know these young ladies are capable, but it takes time and hard work."



Sharon Fanning heads into her fourth season as head coach of the Lady Kats with confidence that her rebuilding mission is complete.

Fanning celebrated her first winning season at UK in 1989-90, as the Lady Kats posted a 23-8 record and won their first National Women's Invitational Tournament title. Both coach and team realized their goals, as the Lady Kats recorded their best record since 1982-83 and made a brief appearance in the Top 25 poll.

Fanning welcomed major improvements last season after watching her first two UK teams struggle. She took over the program in 1987, with the team near the bottom of the Southeastern Conference and little talent in the cupboard. During her first season, her worst fears were realized as injuries and personal problems saw a roster of 15 shrink to

nine en route to an 0-9 conference record and a 14-15 overall mark. The following season, the Lady Kats improved their conference record to 3-6



place showing in league play, despite an overall record of 12-16.

Fanning brought to Kentucky not only an exceptional record, but also a national reputation as an outstanding coach, recruiter and motivator. In 11 memorable seasons at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, Fanning's squads compiled a 189-129 mark, including five straight Southern

Conference championships from 1982-1986. In 1984, the Lady Mocs went 26-5 and were runners-up in the

And while her teams were reaping glory for the school, Coach Fanning was receiving personal honors as well. She was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 1984 and 1985 and was nominated for Kodak's National Coach of the Year honors in 1984. In 1986 she coached the North squad in the U.S. Olympic Festival and in 1987 she was named to the staff of the USA Select team. Last summer, she was on the staff of the USA Junior National team that competed in the World Championship Qualifying Tournament in South America.

The 36-year old Fanning, a native of Chattanooga, completed her undergraduate degree at UTC in 1975



while competing in both basketball and volleyball. She received her master's degree in 1976 from the University of Tennessee, where she served as a graduate assistant coach

to Pat Head Summitt for one year before returning home to build a program at her alma mater.

A noted speaker who is very active in civic affairs, Fanning also served as Coordinator of Women's Athletics at UTC. She is a current member of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Board of Directors.



IERRY McLAUGHLIN

Assistant Coach Flagler College (Fla.), 1977

McLaughlin begins his second season as assistant Lady Kats coach. McLaughlin joins the UK program after serving as assistant coach at New Mexico State University for two years.

A 1977 graduate of Flagler College, McLauglin earned a bachelor's degree in education and helped lead the NMSU Roadrunners to a 26-3 overall record and a 10-0 record in the High Country Athletic Conference in his first season. The Roadrunners finished first in the conference in 1987 and were ranked 19th in the final poll.

In 1982 McLaughlin served as assistant boys coach and head girls coach for the Fife High School basketball team in Tacoma, Wash. After leading the girls team to a 22-3 record and the Seamont League Championships, McLaughlin received coach of the year honors.

Following his position at Fife High School, McLaughlin assumed the assistant coaching position with Temple University in 1982 and helped lead the Owls to the 1982-83 National Women's Invitational Tournament

Before joining the program at NMSU, McLaughlin served as head women's basketball coach at Siena College for two seasons. While at Siena, he compiled a record of 34-24. During the 1986-87 season, his team finished its schedule with a 20-9 overall record and a first-place finish in the MECA conference. He was named MECA Coach of the Year for the season.



KAREN BOOKER

Assistant Coach Vanderbilt, 1987

Booker begins her second season as an assistant coach to Sharon Fanning. Booker served as a volunteer coaching assistant for the Vanderbilt Lady Commodores before joining the Lady Kats staff in 1989.

Booker graduated from Vanderbilt University in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in economics and a minor in business marketing. While at Vanderbilt, she was named team captain and became the all-time leading rebounder and fifth-leading scorer in the history of the Lady Commodores program.

Booker was selected as Vanderbilt's Female Athlete of the Year after leading the SEC in rebounds and making the All-SEC tournament team in 1987. She was the first female to receive the Jim Robins Award for Vanderbilt's Athlete of the Year. Before leaving Vanderbilt, Booker was named to Fast Break Magazine's All-America team.

Booker is a junior member of the Vanderbilt Board of Directors and also works with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.



ILENE HAUSER

Graduate Assistant Idaho State, 1990

Hauser begins her first season as graduate assistant to the Lady Kats basketball staff, replacing Jane Dalton. Hauser's primary responsibilities include working oneon-one with the players, aiding in the coordination of the summer camps and contributing to the day-to-day

operations of the program.

Hauser played basketball at Idaho State for two seasons before earning a bachelor's degree in psychology and a minor in business administration in May, 1990. Prior to that, she attended UCLA for a year and was on basketball scholarship at San Diego State for two seasons. In 1985 she played basketball on the U.S. Women's Maccabiah Team that visited Israel.

While at UCLA in 1987, Hauser served as head junior varsity girls coach and assistant varsity coach at her alma mater Alemany High School in Mission Hills, California. She has also served as a fitness instructor for the Mid Valley Athletic Club in Reseda, Calif., and has coached at the Blue Star and Billie Moore basketball camps.



LISA BRESSMAN

Graduate Assistant

Midwestern State University (Texas), 1987

Lisa enters her second season as graduate assistant to Coach Fanning and the Lady Kats staff, Lisa will be involved with game day activities, equipment, scouting and the organization of the Lady Kats Invitational Tournament

Before coming to Kentucky, Lisa was an assistant for three years at her alma mater, Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls, Texas. She played for two seasons at MSU and graduated magna cum laude in 1987 with an undergraduate degree in physical education. Memorial Oliseum

"HOME OF THE KENTUCKY LADY KATS" (capacity - 8,700)

Memorial Coliseum is the home of one of the richest basketball traditions in the entire world. It is also the home of Coach Sharon Fanning's Kentucky Lady Kats, a team determined to bring glory and excitement to a facility that has known a wealth of both.

For 24 years, the historic coliseum housed the renowned Kentucky Wildcats, who won two national championships and 24 Southeastern Conference titles there under the direction of legendary coaches Adolph Rupp and Joe B. Hall. But the

Wildcats moved downtown to 23,000-seat Rupp Arena in 1976, leaving the 11,500-seat Memorial Coliseum as the exclusive home basketball court of the highly-regarded Lady Kats.

Since then, Memorial Coliseum has undergone renovations to include a state-of-the-art weight room, basketball and administrative offices, a team meeting room and modern dressing and lockerrooms.

The Lady Kats have added a Southeastern Conference title and a National Women's Invitational Tournament Championship to their list of accomplishments,

accomplishments, and have proudly carved a 180-61 home court record into the history of the now 8,700-seat coliseum.

The undisputed highlight of the Lady Kats' Memorial Coliseum era came on a cold winter night in 1983. The date was February 5 and the opponent was No. 5 Old Dominion, with 6-foot-8 All-American center Anne Donovan looming as no foe had before. A record crowd of 10,622 fired-up fans packed

the Coliseum that Saturday evening, and roared hystercially as the sixth-ranked Lady Kats came from 10 points down in the second half for an 80-66 upset win. After the victory the Lady Kats, who were led by their own All-American Valerie Still, climbed to fourth in the national poll. In their three remaining home games, they averaged 7,600 fans. And they easily led the nation in attendance that year.

Just as their male counterparts did before them, the Lady Kats have made Memorial Coliseum the home of a high-class, winning

program. They have never had a bad season at home, and once boasted a 31-game win streak in the Coliseum.

In 1941, University
President H. L. Donovan
began plans for the Coliseum,
when he recommended a
building that would "properly
take care of our athletics, our
health services, our physical
education and our
recreation." The building
was also nicknamed "the
house that Rupp built," since
"the Baron's" standout teams
had long since outgrown
2,800-seat Alumni Coliseum.


Memorial Coliseum was completed in 1950 at a cost of \$3,995,000. The huge

building was dedicated to serve as a memorial to the nearly 10,000 Kentuckians who lost their lives in World War II and the Korean conflict. The Coliseum covers an entire city block and has as much space as a seven-story office building.

Situated along Euclid Avenue, Memorial Coliseum is used primarily for basketball games and Athletic Department offices, but also serves as the site of other sporting events, lectures and concerts.




Memorial Coliseum has been the exclusive basketball home for the Lady Kats since 1976.

Center for Academic & Tutorial Services (CATS)



he University of Kentucky continues to keep the term "student-athlete" in the proper perspective — student first, athlete second.

For that reason, the University of Kentucky opened the nation's first academic center for student-athletes in 1981. The academic center is known as the Center for Academic and Tutorial

Services or simply "CATS."

CATS is located inside Memorial Coliseum.

The center, specifically designed with the student-athlete in mind, contains a large general study area along with numerous smaller rooms used for tutoring. CATS expanded during the past academic year and added a language library, additional tutoring rooms, a media center and a new computer facility.

Currently, the UKAA budgets close to \$500,000 per year for the CATS Center.

"Academically," says UK Basketball Coach Rick Pitino, "we hope to make our players overachieve in the classroom the same

way they do on the basketball court, so that if they don't make it in the NBA, they can leave their college life with the beginning of a great career. That's why we believe CATS is so important to our program."

While Pitino's views on academics are echoed throughout the athletics department, former UK Football Coach Jerry Claiborne put the importance of the CATS Center is perspective when he said:

"There's no question, the CATS Center is a very important part of not only the UK football program, but the entire UK athletics program. Academic pursuits come first at Kentucky."

Indeed, academics do come first. The combination of the CATS Center and Claiborne, who retired after the 1989 football season and has since been replaced by Bill Curry, brought a national championship to UK in 1989. The UK football program was awarded the 1989 College Football Association's Academic Achievement Award for the nation's highest graduation rate for its

1983 freshman class. UK's achievement marked the first time since the inception of the award that a team other than Duke, Virginia or Notre Dame had won the award.

The significance has not been lost on Coach Curry.

"Our CATS Center is one of the best academic services in the land and that's based on results. For Kentucky to be up there with Duke, Virginia and Notre Dame is a real tribute to first, the student-athletes, but also to our academic support staff headed by Bob Bradley."

Bradley, Assistant Athletics Director for Academics, supervises the CATS Center. Bradley is assisted by Barbara Deniston, Director of Student Development, and Mike Jenkins, Academic Counselor. The CATS Center also employs four graduate assistants and numerous tutors, both from the University and surrounding community.

"CATS is an incredible advantage to a student-athlete over another without an academic center," Bradley says. "This is a medium which the student-athlete can get any question

about his or her academic endeavors answered." Bradley also says it helps to have head coaches that place such a strong emphasis on academics. "Many supports systems across the nation do an excellent job at helping their studentathletes," Bradley said. "I have been blessed at Kentucky."

The philosophy at the University of Kentucky is this:
Colleges should be able to afford the

student-athlete with every opportunity to succeed not only in athletics, but in academics as well. Looking at recent statistics in Academic Honor Roll selections and graduation rates, Kentucky is standing by its philosophy.



Wethington began his career in higher education in 1965 as an educational psychology instructor on the Lexington campus of the University and entered administration two years later when he was named director of Maysville Community College. In 1971 he moved to the system office in Lexington as assistant vice president, and became vice president of the Community College System in 1981.

In the University reorganization of 1982, he was named chancellor of the UK system, one of the three major sectors of UK.

Under his leadership the Community College System has set enrollment records and added an entire new college at Owensboro.

Wethington earned his master's and doctorate degrees at UK after completing his undergraduate work at Eastern Kentucky University.

The Casey County native has been active on the national higher education scene, serving as legislation committee chairman of the National Council of State

hen Charles Martin (C.M.) Newton became the University of Kentucky's seventh Director of Athletics on

April 1, 1989, he hit the ground running. Newton's first order of business was to bring respectability back to a basketball program hit hard by an NCAA investigation. He did so by hiring New York Knickerbockers head man Rick Pitino to coach the Wildcats. A few months later, Newton was faced with the task of hiring a football coach to replace the retiring Jerry Claiborne. Newton again rose to the occasion, luring Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year Bill Curry from the University of Alabama to lead the UK program.

Newton recently scored once again with the UK fans when it was announced that UK's football and basketball games will once again be carried on Louisville's clear-channel, 50,000-watt WHAS Radio, for the first time since 1986.

After little more than a year on the job, Newton has become one of the most popular public figures in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. In addition to a lengthy, impressive list of credentials, Newton brought to Kentucky a sparkling reputation at a crucial time in the history of UK Athletics. In accepting the position at his alma mater, Newton summarized his goals and objectives by saying, "I have a resolve to try very hard to continue that great tradition, and at the same time, to totally do it within the NCAA and SEC rules and not sacrifice the academic integrity of this University."

Newton capped an illustrious basketball coaching career by leading his final Vanderbilt University team to a 19-14 record, a second-place SEC finish and its second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance during the 1988-89 season. He was named SEC Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and also received the Kodak NABC District IV Coach of the Year award. Newton served as head basketball coach and associate athletics director at the Nashville school since 1982, compiling a 129-115 record. In 32 years of coaching at Transylvania, Alabama and Vanderbilt, Newton compiled a 509-375 record overall, ranking among the top 10 coaches in the

game in terms of total victories. His Alabama teams won three consecutive Southeastern Conference championships. He finished his career ranked second in career victories in Southeastern Conference games to his mentor, Coach Adolph Rupp.

Perhaps more impressive, however, was Newton's ability to produce winning teams that also possessed exceptional academic credentials. During Newton's tenure at Vanderbilt, 18 Commodores were named to the Academic All-SEC team, over 50 percent more than any other league school, and including his last

graduating class, all 21 seniors received their diplomas.

Newton is highly regarded on the national level. He has served on the board of directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches. He worked six years on the NCAA Basketball Rules Committee, serving as chairman of that elite group for five of those years. He also served as vice president of USA Basketball, the nation's governing body for international amateur basketball.

Newton has literally circled the globe to promote the game of basketball. He served as team manager, a combination coaching and administrative position, on the 1984 U.S. Olympic team that won the gold medal. Indiana coach Bob Knight, who tabbed Newton for the Olympic staff, called him "the finest gentleman in our business." In 1983 and 1987, Newton took Vanderbilt squads to the Republic of China (Taiwan) to represent the United States in the R. William Jones Cup International Tournament, winning the gold medal in 1983 and the silver in 1987. He has also conducted coaching clinics in numerous countries.

Newton began his coaching career at Transylvania College (now Transylvania University) in Lexington. Recommended for the job by Coach Rupp, Newton guided Transy to a 169-137 record in his 12 years at the helm.

In 1969, once again with the backing of Rupp, Newton answered a call from Paul "Bear" Bryant to take on the challenge of building the downtrodden Alabama basketball program. During his 12-year tenure, Newton orchestrated a complete turnaround in the Crimson Tide's basketball fortunes, compiling a sparkling 211-123 record.

In addition to the three SEC championships, Newton guided the Tide to two trips to the NCAA Tournament and four berths in the NIT.

With few horizons left to conquer at Alabama, Newton resigned at the end of the 1980 season to accept a job as assistant commissioner of the Southeastern Conference. A year later, when Vanderbilt athletics director Roy Kramer was searching for a coach of national stature to head the Commodores basketball program, Newton

was the obvious man for the job.

Newton was born Feb. 2, 1930, in Rockwood, Tenn. He grew up in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., where he was eventually named a charter member of that city's Sports Hall of Fame, along with Chris Evert, Julius Boros and the late Brian Piccolo. Newton is married to the former Evelyn Davis of Ft. Lauderdale. The Newtons have three grown children — daughters Deborah and Mrs. Tracy Thompson and son Martin.

Thanks to a \$4.9 million gift from the IBM Corporation, UK continues its role as one of the leading computing universities in the



UK FACULTY BRING \$70 MILLION IN GRANTS, CONTRACTS AND GIFTS

UK's faculty brought in some \$70 million in grants, contracts and gifts from outside sources in the 1989-90 academic year. The record amount was 17% greater than the year before and marked a 70% increase in the past five years. As further indication of UK's faculty expertise, 98% of them have the highest degree attainable in their fields.

UK STUDENTS WIN MANY PRESTIGIOUS AWARDS AND HONORS

The debate team took second-place in the nation's largest invitational collegiate debate tournament in 1990. For three years in a row, the College of Law moot court team has been in the national finals of the intercollegiate moot court competition. A UK nursing student was one of 121 U.S. collegians chosen for the USA Today All-USA College Academic Team. UK's cheerleaders finished second in 1990 for the second straight year in the College Cheerleading Championships. UK was national champion in 1985, '87 and '88. The UK yearbook won first place nationally in competitions sponsored by the Associated Collegiate Press and the National Scholastic Press Association. UK's student newspaper received the All-America honor rating and five marks of distinction, placing it in the top third of the nation's best student newspapers. The UK Jazz Ensemble was voted most outstanding among 14 student combos or big bands invited to perform at the Notre Dame College Jazz Festival, the most prestigious event of its kind in the nation.

THE BLUE AND WHITE FUND

Originated in 1973 by former athletics director Cliff Hagan, the Blue and White Fund's main purpose is to provide financial assistance to the UK athletics program.

Today, producing and maintaining a quality athletics program is a never-ending process. And for that reason, the University of Kentucky Athletics Association is renewing its efforts to raise the funds necessary to be competitive on the national level in every sport.

The major purpose of the Blue and White Fund is to provide scholarships for UK's student-athletes. Last year, 320 student-athletes received grants-in-aid from the University of

Kentucky which allowed them to continue their education.

The Fund also helps underwrite costs associated with the nationally-recognized Center for Academic and Tutorial Services (CATS) located in Memorial Coliseum. In addition, the Fund provides dollars necessary to upgrade the entire athletic physical plant and to plan for the future projects.

Some of the future projects for which the Blue and White Fund would assist include expansion of Commonwealth Stadium from 57,800 to 72,000 and the construction of an indoor football practice facility.

Last year, more than \$2.2 million was

raised through the Blue and White, up from \$800,000 the year before. Under the direction of associate athletics director Gene De-Filippo, the goal next year will double as UKAA becomes more aggresive in its fundraising efforts.

Membership in the Blue and White Fund is open to anyone interested in helping the University of Kentucky student-athletes who participate in one or more of the 19 sports for which UK fields a team.
