The Chatauqua commences here next week. I do not think that I will attend tho, as I do not like to be upinights and that would be the time that I would have to attend I suspect.


One of our towns-folk was turned over in an auto yesterday, and hurt pretty badly. Guess that he had been to Prospect.

They elected a Mr. Lybarger from Ashley for the Supt.


