

## **SG** initiative could alter alcohol rule

At odds with policy: Plan would bring restaurant, bar to the heart of campus

Student Government has initiated a plan to

Student Government has initiated a plan to bring a casual sit-down diner, such as Applebee's, O'Charley's or TGI Friday's, to the Student Center by this time next year, and they're looking into changing the campus alcohol policy to do that.

SG members and others pressing for the restaurant want it to include a full service barsomething that is currently prohibited on campus. Robin Gibbs, the director of Campus Cuisine, said including alcohol would be crucial to the success of the restaurant.

"Without alcohol. I think interest would be limited," she said.

John Herbst, the director of the Student Center, said even if alcohol is allowed back on campus, students who want to drink won't come to the Student Center to do it.

"A facility in the Student Center is probably not the place where they (students) are going to come." Herbst said.

The proposal will be submitted to Pat Terrell, the vice president of Student Affairs. She, President Lee Todd and other administrators will review the plan to decide whether to allow alcohol to students on campus.

Kathryn Vogelsang, the center's intern, was beat with

a baseball bat and stabbed af-

a baseball bat and stabbed after opening her door to Michael Reed, 36, a man police already wanted on probation violation charges.

Safety precautions, were discussed at a meeting at the center last night.

"It's been an awakening for all of us," said Tom Farrell, pastor of the center. "It's a different time than 30 years ago (when the center was builty."

At the meeting, Officer Chris Young of the Lexing-Taylett Urban County Police highlighted some areas

#### Gargoyles 'honor' Duke donors

Gargoyles 'honor' Duke donors

Duke University has more than 100 gargoyles perched on its Gothic-style buildings to ward off evil spirits, but the two newest sculptures ended up spooking the wealthy donors they were intended to honor. A couple who gave \$5.5 million for a new dorm at the Durham, N.C., school was surprised and a little embarrassed to see it adorned by gargoyles in their image. They asked that the caricatures — resembling stone bobblehead dolls — be removed. "They were grateful," said Peter Vaughn, spokesman for Duke's development office. "They just didn't approve of the way we showed our appreciation." The figures, with oversized smilling heads and tiny bodies, depict Aubrey McClendon, a 1981 graduate and chief executive office or Chesapeake Energy Corp. in Oklahoma City, and his wife, Kathleen, who graduated in 1980.





She defied the leadership of her own party by voting against giving the president authority to use military force against fraq.


It was for that kind of independence that Democratic rorsed over to elect her again and again.



## SEC's top offense, defense face off

When you hear someone telling another person to 'break' something, it usually is meant as a term for good luck.

Maybe someone told UK football coach Guy Morris to "break a hand" before he took the field last Saturday against Mississippi State.

After falling behind 17-16 to the Bulldogs last weekend due to a lackluster first half performance from the Cats, Morriss said his team needed a sort of an awakening.

So he did what any normal coach would do: pound his fist into the chalkboard.

"It's something I don't ordinarily do." Morriss said. "It's something you don't plan or stage, but I just felt like at that particular time, we needed waking up a little bit."

It must have worked. Coming out of the locker room, Morriss' hand wasn't the only thing hurting. The Cats took over, pounding MSU and winning the game 45-24.

One of the Cats who paid attention to the sudden outburst was junior wideout Derek Abney, who took his third and fourth punt returns this season for touchdowns after the halftime tirade, earning him his unprecedented third Southeastern Conference Special Teams Player of the Week honor of the year.

"Tve said this before, but I think Derek Abney is pound-for-pound the toughest kid on this football team," Morriss said. "He's certainly proving it."

Abney and the Cats hope to carry over their performance from the second half of the MSU game into this weekend's matchup with the Tigers from LSU. But don't expect a similar outburst to come against the team from the Bayou. The Tigers' scoring defense ranks first in the SEC and fifth in the nation, holding opponents to a measly 13.5 points a game. That should make an interesting contrast to the Cats' 34.9 offensive point average, which leads the conference on the other side of the ball. "LSU is a great team," said linebacker Morris Lane. "They're in the top 20 in the country, and whenever you're playing great athletes like that you really want to step up. They came in here last year and we played tough against them, but this year we want to turn the corner."

Morriss to walk away on top again this Saturday?

"If it will get us a win, then yeah it is," he said.

Derek Abney was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for the third time after his two-touchdown performance against Mississippi State last Saturday.
