

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. —It was a fitting end to a horrific week.

UK traveled to Knoxville Saturday to face its No. 1-ranked archrival Tennessee Volunteers with hearts still heavy from a teammate and friend's deaths, and came home with a demoralizing 59-21 defeat.

The Vols, in front of a ridiculously raucous home crowd of 107,252, thrived on a Cat team void of emotion, a team that had used all of that emotion when

dealing with deaths, funerals and hospitals during a week that seemed to last a year.

The Cats were battered emotionally, then smacked around physically, as they gave a valiant, but vain effort against perhaps the best college football team in the country. UK head coach Hal Mumme said he knew early the Cats were in trouble.

"You could just see it in their eyes," Mumme said. "I felt sorry for them, but I was proud. They never quit."

FIJI uses grant for new lab

A just reward: Fraternity takes \$20K for going dry, turns normal room into high-tech lab for its members

On Feb. 1, 1998, the UK chapter of Phi Gamma Delta social fraternity vot-ed unanimously to ban alcohol from its house.

nouse.

In September, national officials at the fraternity's international head-quarters rewarded the chapter with a \$20,000 educational grant for being one

of the first 20 chapters to voluntarily accept the alcohol-free policy. The chapter used the grant to transform a room in its house into a new computer lab. The new lab contains four Pentium II computers, a color scanner, a laser jet printer, a color likjet printer and two zip drives. All four computers in the lab are networked together and provide the 25 members and 12 pledges with access to

the UK network via a PPP account.
Chapter Historian Scott Baker thinks the new lab is a positive addition to the fraternity house.

"Tilke the fact that more of my studies can be done without the hassle of going to the University Jab," Baker said.
An increase in alcohol-related incidents, such as the death of Scott Krueger, a pledge at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, prompted the fraternity's headquarters to offer the grants as an incentive to remove alcohol from all chapters. All Phi Gamma Delta chapters must be dry by January 2000.

Police: UK student at Haney's

Lexington detective says student 'spent time at bar owner's home before being killed by train

A UK student who died after being hit by a train two weeks ago had been at the same bar owner's home as the students involved in last Sunday's fatal drunken-driving accident, police said.

Chad Alan Clore. 20, spent time at the home of James Haney Jr. on Nov. 6 just before he died, Lexington Police bet. David Lyons said. Haney owns Haney's Tavern on Leestown Road. His home adjoins the bar.

Jason Watts and others. Lyons said. Clore left the home by himself, while his friends were still there. He wandered onto nearby railroad tracks and was struck by a train at about 3:30 a.m.

His blood-alcohol level was 0.238. Drivers in Kentucky are considered to be intoxicated at a blood-alcohol level of 0.10.

On Nov. 15, after visiting Haney's home. Watts lost control of his pickup near Somerset. UK redshirt freshman Arthur Steinmetz, 19, and Eastern Kentucky University student Christopher Brock, 21, were killed in the crash.

All three men had a blood-alcohol level higher than the legal limit for drivers in Kentucky.

Watts has been charged with two counts of second-degree manslaughter and one count of drunk, endriving.

Watts was listed in good condition at UK Hospital last night.

Lyons said he interviewed both Watts and Haney after Clore's death. Haney would not say whether Clore was drinking at his place, Lyons said.

Clore had called his roommates and left a message on the answering machine shortly before his death saying he needed a ride home. Lyons said.

Police ruled the Clore's an accident, but that didn't put to rest all of the questions in Lyons' mind.

"One curious thing was why Clore was in that area," Lyons said. "Once we found out he had beat Haney's, it made sense."

The place where Clore was found is several miles away from campus and from downtown bars.

Lyons said his investigation indicated that Clore and Watts met at Dreadlocks, a club on West Main Street downtown, at about midnight. They left with several other people and went to Haney's.

An LD. belonging to a friend was found with Clore's body.

Although lending another person an LD. for improper use is illegal. Lyons said the individual will probably not be prosecuted.

"He was cooperative. That person is walking in a pretty hard set of shoes," Lyons said. "It's a tragic set of circumstances and there would be no point in making it worse."



WASHINGTON — Saving Social Security while cutting taxes will be Rep. Bob Livingston's top order of business when he assumes leadership of the House next year, the speaker-to-be said yesterday. In his first TV interview since his ascendancy to the GOP leadership position, Livingston told NBC that a balanced budget, accomplished with the help of the Social Security surplus, could be maintained even with a major tax cut. Livingston will be working with a narrow 233-211 majority, with one Democratic-voting independent, after the Republicans lost five seats in the last election.





"I thought his play was pretty good," Mumme said. "I know he gave up a few big plays, but overall in the scheme of things, it wasn't bad for your first start."


Despite the loss, UK doesn't have to end its season on such a disappointing note, something the seniors are grateful to have.

for sprinkler systems in the residence halls of
public universities. Patton felt it was solely the
job of university's housing officials to find funding for those changes.

Attention turned to sprinklers earlier this fall
after a student at Murray State University was
killed in a dorm fire. The dorm reportedly had no
sprinklers in it.

Further investigation found that the Murray
State is not the only campus that has dorms without sprinkler systems. Holmes Hall at UK is just
another example.

In more routine matters, the state should not stick its nose in university business because politics and education do not mix. In more routine cases, the legislature should leave it up to the administrations to develop, improve and enforce policies, making sure buildings are up to code.

But the death at Murray State and the recent fire at a fraternity house at Western Kentucky University changed things and exposed a need for the state to take matters into its own hands because universities have failed to keep their houses (a.k.a. dorms) in order.

Legislators should step up and show they care by helping UK and other universities. In a time when our state is flush with a budget surplus, surely the governor and legislators could help by slashing through red tape and pumping overdue money into dormitories.

And if saving human life is not incentive enough, perhaps the bean counters in Frankfort should realize that failure to address this problem today, could result in more costly lawsuits tomorrow.


