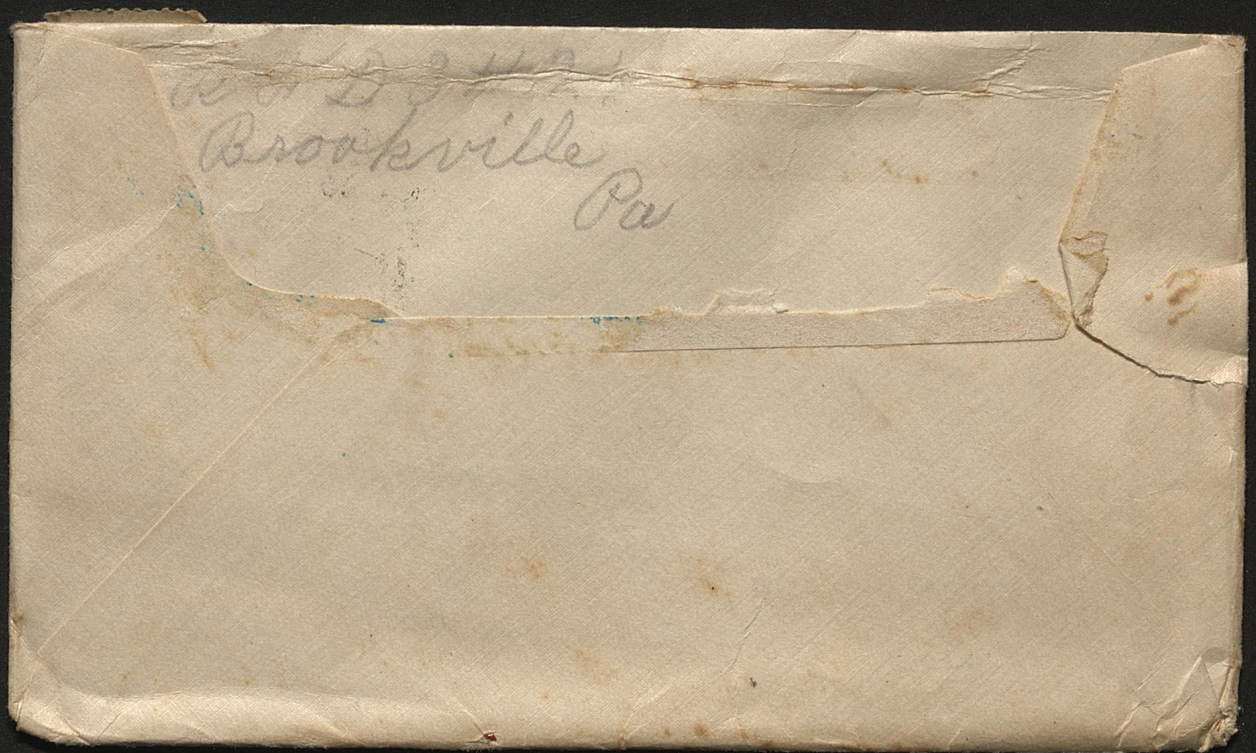

(The Big Day ?)

Dear Betty:-

Who said this was a big day, gosh! I wouldn't even know it was Armistice Day, if I didn't know the date. They don't celebrate one way or the other here, I think the Legion is dead. Hope you had a grand and glorious time, tell me all about it.

They had a big time here last Saturday. North Carolina University played S. C. University and won 40-0. Great score, eh? I don't know when I ever saw just huge fellows and good-looking, oh boys. That night they simply took the town by storm, I bet there was more noise here than there has been since the end of the war.

I know you wish I wouldn't be so prompt in answering your letters, but I will tell you why I am so prompt this time. I am without a car and am staying in the house, so am taking this opportunity of answering any and all letters I happen to have, so excuse please. I'm terribly lost without my car, had to put it in the garage to have the valves ground and the brakes re-lined, am supposed to have it back Wednesday, don't know whether I can live without it that long or not. Am going to Maysville, S. C., just as soon as I get it.

Did you have a good time at the Auxiliary card party and did you win a prize? I hope they had better weather than we had. We have had and are still having the gloomiest weather, makes you feel all down in the dumps-cold, brr. I just nearly freeze all the time. 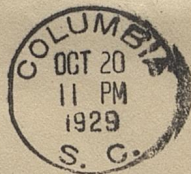

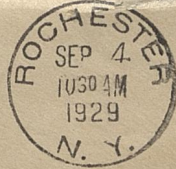

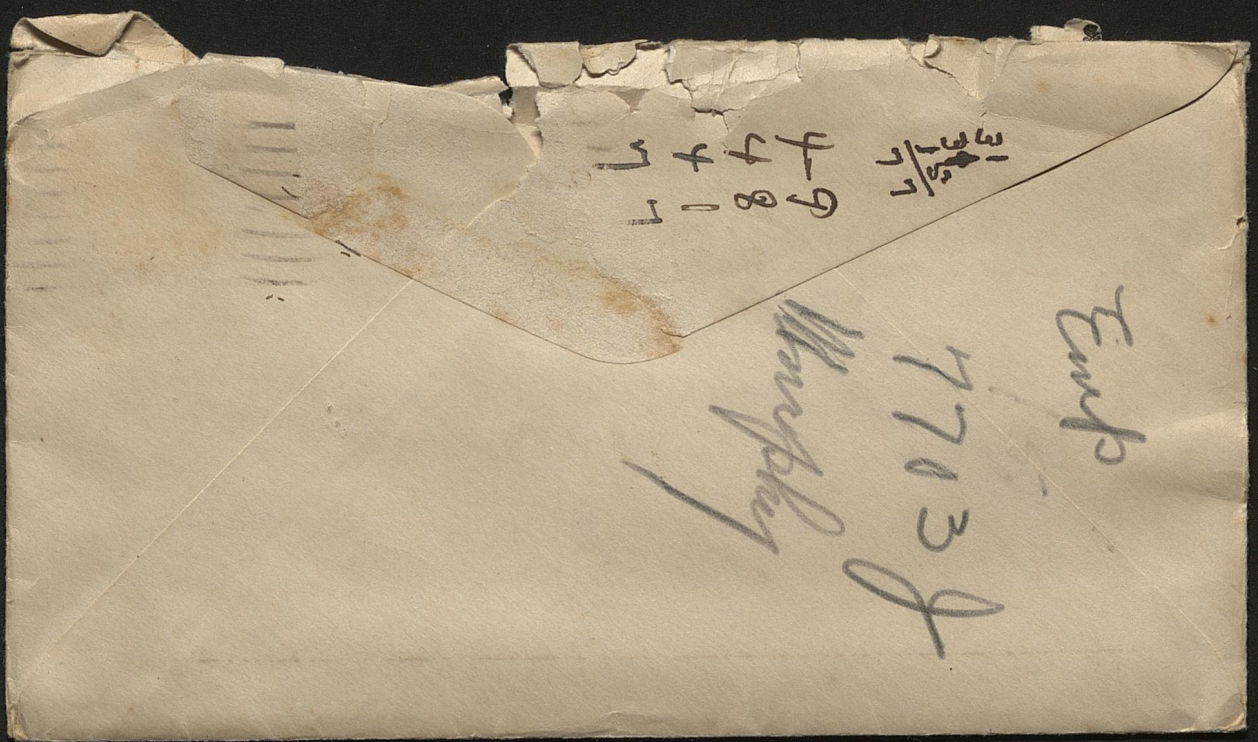
