I am afraid that had you been here you would have had trouble with your car getting it out of your garage on Virginia park. Ha Ha.

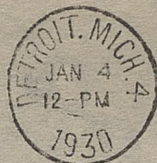
Tell Dorabelle that I received her card also for which I thank her I did not mail her one of mine for I did not know her address.

Are you still planning on taking a trip to Europe this summer, if so when do you expect to leave Florida? I hear there are quite a number of people going to leave early in the spring.

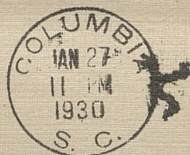

Dear Betty:-

I feel so full 'o pep and industrious this morning for some reason I really can't account for it, 'cause I was up unusually late last night and should feel sleepy, but don't. Last night was the first time I really felt I could stay out any length of time on account of Dad, but he felt so much better and looks so much better, we all decided it would be O.K., so I did. Met the cutest fellow from W. Palm Beach and believe me he certainly has more pep than I have seen for some time, we all went places and did things up until 2:00 A.M. (do I hear you say you are shocked, yes I know) A grand time was had by all, ha.

So glad to hear you made good with your farm, you really are quite the farmer, nicht wahr? Be sure and fill yourself up with news so you can spill it when you see me and for John's sake, don't make your stay as short as you did last time-why can't you stay a while and lets go down to Charleston for a day, think it over. Are you going back by yourself?

We are having the grandest weather at last and with promises of very hot weather soon. Not so good. I have been going to the woods all spring getting wild flowers and now I have the house full of wild honeysuckle, bay blossoms, mountain laurel and beautiful yellow roses. Columbia is at its prettiest at this time of the year and the woods are beautiful, outside of that I still have no use for this part of the country. This afternoon the May Queen is to be coronated at Columbia College and I am going out. Judge Tedder of Lauderdale has a daughter who attends Columbia Collge, I have seen her several times., although not to speak to.

Haven't heard from Mrs. Morris for some time, she must be having a grand time. Is Mr. Morris still in Lauderdale?

When we drove to Columbia we made Darien, Ga., the first time and the second trip made Brunswick the first night out, making Columbia by noon the next day.

Saturday P.M.
(not so early)

I see I bragged too soon, I was just nearing the end of your letter when Mrs. McCarty drove up and insisted upon me going with her, so everything had to stop for a while. She comes by twice a day just as regular and if I don't go with her, or give her a very good reason for not going, she gets all peeved. 'S'too bad, eh?

Saw some of the loveliest strawberries in the store this a.m. shipped from Starke, Fla. I didn't know they even raised berries around Starke-but they certainly are beauties. Berries are quite cheap now, home grown ones are coming and at the market the other evening I bought a quart for ten cents, the berries were small but very firm and sweet.

Listen old deah, come again right soon and continue with the long letters, you don't know how I love to receive them-if it were not for the lovely letters I receive from so many of my friends I don't know what I would do at times-they can't come fast enough.

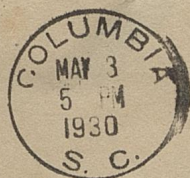

matter - I forgot - only a little letter on

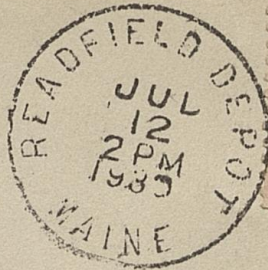
a good time in South Hadley. My animals are there,
