Greetings; It is about time that I am writing to you, but gosh, I am so lazy and tired all the time, that it isn't even funny, don't know what I ould doo if I had a job like you have, and have to realy work for a living. your most welcome letter arrived tonight and you may be sure it was more then welcome, and was glad to hear that you were not cought by the City Slicker, osh some people has a nerve, and the funny thing about it most of them gets away with it, it seems as though that is the only way you can make any money these days, as all I get, whichlisn't much, just about lasts me until the next pay check. Sorry to hear about your brother being in Bethesda again, is it the same old trouble? you would think they would be able to clear it up, wouldn't you think so?, don't think they know what is the trouble. Wasn't feeling so well for the last month, was very irritated so thought I would get away from everything, and the 18th. of Feb. took the train for Buffalo and walked in un-anounced, and left the following Monday morning, didn't do anything exciting, except visit with all I could get around to see, and just took it easy for the few days, Belle came in town that Saturday, and we went over to see Aunt Eliza, Anna Barrett then back to Margs for the evening, it is the same there, nothing happens to write about, Anna Barrett is back teaching bridge and we had a nice visit talking about it, and some new ideas that came out in the last four years, Buffalo was lucky this winter, they didn't get too much snow, even though it was very cold, most of the storms by-passed them. Before I forget it, will you see your friend, the one that sells the orange blossom honey, either the dealer or if you would get a chance to go out to where they make it, would you have them send me four (4) five lb. cans, they can either send it C.O.D. or let me know the cost and will send a check to them, or to you either way you care to handle it, if they would send it C.O.D. would appreciate it if they would let me know when they will send it also the amount, as like to give the money to Mrs. Callan before anything comes that way, my boss was asking if I would get him some, he fell and broke four ribs and one of them punctured his lung and was laid up for two months, and I had a can left from the time I was down there and gave it to him, he realy likes it and said it was the only thing he dould eat and enjoy and the can didn't last long enough, so told him it should be on the market some time in April and would aske you to have some shipped. have some shipped. Last Monday, aftet the stamp club meeting, went to the bridge club, but just could get together with my partner, even though we play a lot together, also the hands were bad, most of them the bidder went down, was very tired and wouldn't of played only didn't want to disapoint my partner, and we didn't get started until near 8:50 and played 27 boards, and was near 1 before we finished, so we didn't wait to see how we made out, but know we will be tied for bottom, as usual, this Friday, Ester and I are going out to the Bedell's house for dimer and bridge, we will start early as we will leave right after work, and should be through with the dinner at least by 6, and have a long session, we played at Ester's appartment about a month ago, and had a nice time, wasn't figuring on playing so long but before we knew it, it was midnight, but that is all right as we can sleep Sat. morning, that is part of it, as have to meet a fellow downtown at 2 P.M. and have to get my breakfast before that, so will have to use all my energy to get up at noon. think I'll put your bridge question in a pack of cards and bring it with me next Friday, and see who they would bid it and play it, think it would be something different, that is while we are resting before we get down to playing. This last month, have been kind of busy with the stamps, as had negelated them for several months, and had a large box to put in the album, and still have a lot to do, think this week end that is Sat. evening and Sunday will find me with my nose in them, as want to get them all set and see just what I need, also check my reference book and see if all the American stamps are check off, that is the ones I have, and then try to get the ones I don't have, wish I could find a lot of stamps there that I havn't, when ever I get a chance to get into one of the storrage rooms in one of the government buildings, I look for them but darn it, they don't save the envelopes, only the correspondence.

Last Saturday, went over to Ed. Callahans house for dinner and then we spent the evening over with a friend of theirs, we played poker and what a game, everybody had their pet game, and never knew they could play so many different kind of sames, and so many combinations of wild cards, anyway, I went back to the Callahans with 2:50 winnings, so that wasn't so bad, stayed there all night, and the next day, went riding in Maryland trying to see what I could find in relards to an effice, but it was useless, as there wasn't enything for rent, and the prices they want for houses was out of the question, they don't have any office buildings of any size and only enquired at a couple of real estate agents, as am still waiting for the license to come, last Sat. went downtown and looked at some equiptment, and found out that I could set up a fair office, with a diethermy, ultra violet, inira red, portable sterilizer, blood pressure machine, and waiting room furnature for about 2000, thought it would cost more then that, and only have to pay 10 percent down, and the monthly payments would be about 65, for three years, with the option to pay it sooner if I want to, but the housing condition, or the rent has me stumpted, with I could get next to some rich person that has a house I could use for a while until I have enough money to vuild one of my own, but know that is just wishing and will have to try to figure out some other way, don't know if and when I decide to start, but want to be sure that everything is all right before I venture into any dot, would like to locate near D.C. as hope to draw from friends, as have to use everybody to get started, Ed. wants me to go out near the N.E. section, and said he would help me to set up the office, that is in regards to the building and painging, and then would be nearr him and he could refer his friends to me easier that way, then if I was way over in Bethesda or near there, as it would be too far to tryvel. Received your welcome telegrams, the one you sent Dec. 31st, arrived here Jan. 3rd, late in the morning, some speed, isn't it; but the one sent to the Lord Baltimore I got that Sunday afternoon, had sort of a feeling that you would send one, and was just what I needed to give me encouragement in continuing the exam, and you may be sure I needed all I could get, asneven though I had about three months to study, couldn't assimilate anything, and told Dr. Smith that too, he said the exam wouldn't be hard, and if it was considered easy, I wouldn't want to take their hard one, as it sure was tough, there was to be four taking it, but one couldn't make it, so three of us took it, and the other two just got out of school and they said it was a tough one, one of the fellows just finished at the National and we had a nice visit about the school and whow we knew, he didn't know many we knew, and that was understood, as I left there15 years ago,

Getting back to the exam, we started writing at 8;30 Sat. morning and with time out at noon and evening for something to cat, we finished up at 11;30 P.M. then the three of us went out for some coffee and, and hash over the exam, and finally got to bed at 2, and up at 7, had breakfast and started to write at 8, and had an half an hour off at noon for dimmer, and finished the written exams at 8 then took the practicle exam in
