Adolph Rupp, the Baron, is dead at 76

Cancer finally takes its toll

After an extended illness, former UK basketball coach Adolph Frederick Rupp, the Baron of basketball, died at 10:45 p.m. Saturday at the University of Kentucky Medical Center.

The 76-year-old Rupp had been hospitalized at the Medical Center since Nov. 96 for treatment of cancer of the spine, which also caused heart andkidney complications. Rupp was also a diabetic. His body was taken to Milward's Funeral Home where funeral arrangements were set for 1:30 p.m. Tuseday at the Central Christian Church, 205 E. Short St. Rupp was born Sept. 1, 1991, in Halstead, Kan., the son of Henry and Anna Rupp He attended Kansas University, where he received his Bachelor's Degree in 1923. He then went to Columbia University for his masters in educational administration, which he received in 1930.


In addition to his high blood pressure, Rupp's diabetes caused him to miss several weeks of the 1971-72 season, during which time then-assistant coach Joe Hall ran the team. Also during that time, Rupp had to keep his foot propped up on a pillow for several games.

The Baron became seriously ill in late October, 1976. He never would discuss his condition and neither would his doctors, but his weakening voice made it obvious.

Rupp's death came almost exactly one year from the date Rupp Arena was dedicated in his name. That night, the UK basketball team played Kansas University, the same team that Kentucky had defeated only minutes before Rupp died.



His death was not unexpected

We had known for more than a year that Adolph Frederick Rupp's days were numbered. We knew he had cancer and that it was methodically, but surely, killing

It may seem cold and callous, but we were preparing his obituary all along, occasionally adding pieces of information for the time we would have to use it—like today.

During those 14 months no one said anything about Uncle Adolph's condition, let alone his fate. Out or respect for the man, no one was so daring so crass, to tell all.

We just waited.

The Baron died at 10-45 Saturday night; ironically, about 10 minutes after Kentucky polished off his alma mater. Kansas University.

He will go down in the history books as the winningest college basketball coach of all time—in 42 years at Kentucky he massed 879 victories, 190 losses, for an 822 years at Kentucky he massed 879 victories, 190 losses, for an as winning percentage. No one is close to that record and no one will probably approach it.

Rupp proudly said so two years ago.

The greatest coach of them all

Through winning basketball, the Baron instilled state pride

Adolph Rupp brought fame and success to the University in a way that very few can. Through his championship teams and exciting brand of basketball, people throughout the state identified with the school and gave it the support

identified with the school and gave it the support in needed to become a major institution in many other ways. Kentuckians who were stung by insults about their "hick" state felt vindicated by a basketball team that dominated the sport. The Man in the Brown Suit's record of 879 victories and 190 losses may never be broken. During a 42-year career, the Baron won the NCAA championship four times, the National leastificing Townsment once and captured the Invitational Tournament once and captured the Southeastern Conference title 27 times. Twenty-two of his players were All-America and seven became Olympians. He never had a losing

became Olympians. He never had a losing season.

By sheer force of success, Adolph Rupp propelled Dr. Naismith's recreation into big-time sport, especially in this part of the country. In Kentucky, basketball goals adorn barns and garages from Paducah to Ashland, as the "city game" became an obsession in a rural state primarily because of Rupp's influence.

His overwhelming success in the SEC made the other schools develop major programs and build modern facilities simply to escape humiliation.

Perhaps the most impressive monument to Rupp is the Lexington arena named after him, a

tribute to an incredible history of success, if not,

tribute to an incredible history of success, it not, perhaps, responsible urban planning.
Rupp's personality is nearly as remarkable as his success. At times scowling, playful, growling and sarcastic, the man seemed to have much more personality than many coaches today. Unlike Rupp, modern coaches often eschewiging critteism or expressing themselves, for fear of giving rivals an advantage.

Always ready with an anactote, platitude or colorful remark, Rupp was a sportswriters gold mine. He was ready, willing and able to comment on the game and his players, for he understood the influence of the press and how to

deal with its representatives.

With his death, Adolph Rupp leaves an immense legacy to his adopted school. In maintaining his standards of excellence, the UK basketball team has continued to play at the top against competition Rupp never had to face

Something that will be more difficult to continue is the presence and character that Rupp gave brought to Kentucky; his determination to get the most from his players and to play only to

Alabama football coach Paul "Bear" Bryant who left UK after tiring of the battle for priority against Rupp, said upon hearing of his death, "The word legend is sometimes thrown around too loosely, but he is truly a legend."





Although the victory was dampened by the death of former UK basketball coach Adolph Rupp only minutes after the game's conclusion, top-ranked Kentucky captured an important confidence builder with its third win of the season in as many tries, edging Kansas 73-65 Saturday night in Lawrence. It wasn't an easy game for Kentucky, who fell behind by as much as six points in the opening half.

The trouble began when UK committed several early utrnovers (22 for the game) to hand the Jayhawks a 14-8 lead. But the Wildcats reeled off six straight points, including 6-10 center Mike Phillips' two free throws to knot the score at 14-14.


