# 'Hazing' party host: Fraternity is innocent

No hazing. Not even close. "No, I repeat, no hazing was going on. It was a misunderstand-ing, nothing but an innocent cele-bration," said Seth Burnett, a civil engineering senior and a member of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon social

engineering senior and a member of the Sigma Alpha Epsilons oscial fraternity.

"All hazing allegations are refutable. In the end, once all evidence has been presented, I feel confident that we will be cleared of all charges.


Burnett hosted the May 15 party for SAE pledges at his home on 410 Pennsylvania Court when police showed up at 2:30 a.m. responding to a neighbor's complaint that they were being too loud.

Also untrue, he said.

For Burnett and the rest of the fraternity, charges of hazing by UK officials have left them guilty until proven innocent, he said.

"It's pathetic the way this case has been blown out of proportion," Burnett said, "In fact we re innocent, when everyone has already condemned us in their own minds."

The May 16 Lexington Police report documents the citations

District Court records only show Burnett receiving a citation for violating a noise ordinance and providing alcohol to minors. Police also cited nine minors for possession of alcohol.

# Office plans ethnic event

Twenty-five UK students will gain a better understanding of how their cultures influence their behaviors and interactions with others by attending a two day cross-cultural workshop in Faulush, Kv, later this month.

The Office of International Affairs sponsors this semi-annual event to teach students from various ethnic backgrounds to appreciate cultural differences.

This fall's workshop at the Kentucky Leadership Center will be held on Sept. 20-21 for a cost of \$10, which covers housing and transportation.

Pending approval of an SGA bill, food may cost another \$10. The International Student Council, Cosmopolitan Club, Arts and Senator at Large Carrie Hagan are sponsoring the bill.

are sponsoring the bill.

Because enrollment is limited, students must complete an application at 203 Bradley Hall or from resident hall directors and return it by Sept. 5. Caroline Holmes, a foreign student adviser who has helped organize and lead the event for the past several years, said it gives international and American students a chance to get away from campus and make new friends.

Of the 1.500 international

from campus and make new friends.

Of the 1,500 international students at UK, about half are undergraduates, Holmes said. She has found that students who are new to the country have trouble making new friends because of cultural differences that reach beyond just language and customs.

Americans tend to interact differently and have a wide range of friends, Holmes said. International students — who generally have fewer but closer relationships — often interpret this openness as an invitation to deeper friendships.

In addition, Holmes said, some Americans and different ethnic

groups tend to stereotype and ignore different nationality groups as a whole.

To counteract these behaviors around campus, Holmes and her colleagues have designed the workshop from information they received at national workshops and training sessions.

Hege Johansson, a graduate student from Norway, has helped lead several workshops and has used past workshop some past workshop. Johansson at the past workshop of the workshop of the workshop of the workshop contempted to include aspects of her anthropology background, but the core of the workshop centered around discussion groups.

Although students are never taught to stereotype or label, the role-playing games are designed to contrast two simulated cultures, Johansson said.

For example, students acting out Culture A would have a list of

For example, students acting out Culture A would have a list of specific characteristics to follow such as "extroverted personality" and "aggressive mannerisms," while Culture B might be introverted and timid.

Graduate Lily Arasaratnam, who participated in the workshops in 1995, said one role-playing simulation also included speaking languages unknown to the other culture. In discussions afterward, she found that each culture misinterpreted the other's actions as offensive.



This dream world is what you expect and pay for. It's not a bad thing, but it is an escape from life and not life itself.

Celebration, Florida is a small community based on "a simpler time" in America, a time before urban decay, swidespread crime and the terror of city life. All aspects of the town, from its visions of immaculate avenues to its exclusionary housing tracts, are to provide a feeling of security that supposedly existed in some romantic past. The view is strikingly similar to a Disney park, except this city is not a vacation. All of life is to be a island of calm for those who can afford to forget the ugliness of the outside world. An era when towns were not graceless places to live, but actual communities. This utopi-

an past never existed but Disney's attempt to recreate it will bear new impediments to true community.

Like gated neighborhoods and survivalist compounds, Celebration is antisociety. Celebration is just a larger version of the old "not in my backyard" mentality. Sure, there are problems that need to be worked on, but as long as they are not my problems, it will not face them.

By turning their backs on those who don't live there, they destroy any true sense of belonging their town is intended to create.

How do you eliminate poverty? Remove the poor from town. How do you cut crime? Keep out those who don't live in town. How do you eliminate unhappiness? Well, you can't. But you can whitewash your locality until those other people's problems seem to disappear. But those 'other people," who clean the bathrooms and run the QuickiMarts of Cele-

The strength of late 20th Century America is its willingness to face up to problems. In reality, the former America that Celebration endeavors to capture buried its unwanted in slums, ghettoes, buried its unwanted in slums, gnettoes, and quarters.

These were not solutions: poverty is a fact and no amount of relocating will end it, despite attempts to cleanse the "better" side of the tracks and to permit the poor classes to know where they stood. Out-

classes to know where they stood. Outside.

Celebration serves these same purposes. The unity of its residents is "us against them", a solidarity against the outsiders with whom they no longer wish to associate. Those outsiders are not criminals or thugs, they are you and me.

This idea of what urban life should be in the 21st Century is in danger of explo-

sive popularity. Exclusionist neighborhoods already sprout from the suburban landscape like black volcanic prominences which the former residents are advised to steer clear of. And as more and more citizens withdraw from the public at large we as a society grow weaker.

Celebration is an anti-community. Real community is based on gathering with all of our neighbors, not just those with lawns like ours.

We help the less fortunate, we teach the less educated, we clothe the victims of misfortune. We do not abandon the rest of our friends to their fate while we live fairy tale lives.

Community is the dirt of reality under our nails. The better future lies in less Celebrations and more true neighborhoods.
