

I know all men by these presents that we Ralph Burton and James Walker

are held & firmly bound unto Wm Jarvis assignee of Robert Goodrich

in the just & full sum of Seven pounds & eight pence

to be paid to the said William Jarvis assignee of Robert Goodrich his certain attorney, heirs, executors, administrators or assigns to which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors & administrators jointly & severally firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals and dated this nineteenth day of July 1798

The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound Ralph Burton hath

obtained from the County Court of Charles City an Injunction to stay all further proceedings on an ~~Judgment~~ <sup>Execution</sup> ~~obtained~~ <sup>obtained</sup> by the abovesaid Jarvis assignee as aforesaid against the said Ralph Burton

for the sum of fifteen shillings ten pence with 5 pence interest thereon from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 1798 till payment & ~~the~~ <sup>five</sup> dollars & seventy three cents & costs ~~of~~ <sup>of</sup> the matter thereof be heard in Equity in the said County Court. If therefore the said Ralph Burton

shall well and truly satisfy & pay unto the said William Jarvis assignee of Robt Goodrich his certain attorney, his heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns the aforesaid sum of fifteen shillings ten pence five dollars & seventy three cents ~~and~~ & costs as aforesaid and all such sums of money and costs as shall hereafter become due unto the said William Jarvis assignee as aforesaid on the ~~Judgment~~ <sup>Execution</sup>

Execution aforesaid stayed; in case the Injunction aforesaid shall be dissolved then the above obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force & Virtue. Ralph Burton
