

Copy of Affidavit of Joseph T. Mullen  
In regard to pension claim of E. W. Strawn  
Private Co. H. 189 O.V.A.

I was a member of same Co and regiment as  
(E. W. Strawn) Claimant. he was a strong able bodied  
man during that time as far as I know - I never  
having any sickness until the later part  
of September 1865. while laying in camp  
near Nashville Tenn a day or two before  
we were mustered out. Claimant was  
taken very sick at the quarters. the trouble  
seemed to be with his stomach. he  
suffered a great deal of pain and  
vomited a great deal. after which he  
was very weak and remained so  
what little time I knew of him after  
that. after we were mustered out  
he was still so weak. that he could  
not march and carry his knapsack  
to the depot. and I carried it for  
him. and I carried it for him at every  
place we had any marching to do  
until we reached Camp Chase Ohio  
when we were paid off.

I know nothing of Claimant since  
his discharge. Never having seen  
him since
