To day being rainy & agreeable to
 promise of shall try to write you a few lines
 which will be the best of my knowledge at
~~the~~ this time. That in regard to mothers affairs
 and the children mother is quite sick at this
 time as to her affairs I know little or nothing
 about of but seldom go there and never make
 any inquiries at all about her affairs But if it
 is your request I will find out and let you
 know in my next letter in answer to yours
 as to the negroes and stock I can say something
 about she owns verry good head of stock of every
 kind negroes she owns fifteen some ^{very} valuable
 ones too well about the children William
 is living at mothers I believe he is making
 a living at his trade he is a verry good dentice
 I told him that you would like for him come to
 Kentucky and try his luck with you. Joseph
 is living in Essex county he has two children
 he is a dentice also Horace is managing mothers
 affairs Betsy and Kitty both lives with mother Betsy
 is not married as to myself I am living in log
 cabin recently named Hunters Hill or Old Point
