Dear Friend

Your two favors  
enclosing C. C. and G. E. Returns  
for the "Months" <sup>Jan + Feb</sup> are just at hand  
for which I am much obliged.  
I have signed and forwarded  
them. I am on duty to day  
which is the first for several days.  
I have been very sick, bed fast,  
with a severe return of bloody  
flux. I am so weak now that  
I can scarcely walk owing to the  
great loss of blood. But the duty  
that I am now on is very light  
but it is very confining. I believe  
I wrote you before that I was now  
Adjutant of 1<sup>st</sup> B Co No 1. I wrote  
you a few days ago I have heard  
no echo from it yet I hope I shall  
soon. Capt Finney was married  
last Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> inst. Capt Ward  
leaves this evening on leave of absence  
for 20 days. We have heard that the  
5<sup>th</sup> was to be ordered to Knoxville. Write  
me what are your prospects and  
where are you going - And if you  
don't know without then all I have to  
say is "Search the scripture and see  
where you come from and where you are going"
