Inventory of the effects of Franklin Furey, late
a Private of Captain M A Cook's Company I of
the Eighth Regiment of New York Artillery Volunteers, who was enrolled as
a Private at Brown in the State of New York on
the 11th day of August 1862, and mustered into the service of the United
States as a Private on the 22nd day of August 1862, at Sherkport, N.Y.,
in Company I, 8th Regiment of New York Volunteers, to serve three
years or during the war; he was born in Pittsford in the State
of New York; he was 25 years of age, 5 feet 9 inches
high, Fair complexion, blue eyes, brown hair, and by occupation, when enrolled,
a Farmer; he died in Rebel Prison, at
Salisbury, N.C. on the 25th day of February 1865, by
reason of Disuse while in Prison.
