I am the claimant in this case for pension & about the first of Aug. 1864 when at Gun Powder River I first took cold Malaria & sore throat & in a few days we went to Camp Bradford & then I got worse with these diseases & had something like heart disease & had these diseases at my discharge I did not go to hospital, & I was not treated while in the army by any surgeon we had no Dr with us in the army where I was taken sick & the surgeon had gone home when we got to Camp Bradford Md. I was sick with these diseases when I came home & in about 4 or 5 da. I had to take my bed & I was confined to my house & not able to work with Malaria chills & fever, disease of Throat & heart disease till Spring of 1865 & was almost a skeleton of my former self since that time to the present I have suffered with all the above diseases by spells in each year to the present. Dr G. G. Hildreth now dead treated me for about 8 mon after my discharge & then Dr Vernon now dead treated me from time Dr Hildreth quit to Spring of 1865. There from Spring of 1865 to about 1872 Dr Ball & Beckworth both now dead treated me on & off to 1872 & at that time Dr Halderman began to treat me & has treated me on & off to the present & I moved
