January 19th

The faculty met as usual Messrs. Puerk and Pinkerton asked permission to board in town. They were required to procure the consent of their parents, and also report to Pres. Patterson the name of the family with which they expect to board. Messrs. Dobbell and Stratton were cited to appear before the faculty Nov. 24th, and nearly every meeting since, to explain the cause of their continued absence from all school duties. Both of these gentlemen neglected the citation till this meeting when Mr. Stratton was present. He acknowledged that he had neglected his duties without good reason and asked that he be allowed three weeks in which to improve his records. His request was granted.
