My dear Sir

You will please excuse this intrusion upon your notice. I address you in behalf of our Society. You are acquainted (I suppose) with our plans & operations - our only object is to furnish the Gospel to the House of Israel, by means of Missionaries, Colporteurs &c - we meet with very encouraging success.
