### Sanborn Insurance Maps

Gwen Curtis and John Stachacz have compiled a guide to the Sanborn Insurance maps of Kentucky, which are in the King Library map collection. Although the maps were originally created for use by insurance underwriters to aid in determining the risk involved in insuring urban buildings, the maps have evolved into rich primary source material. They clearly indicate location, size, structure and use of buildings in over 150 Kentucky cities and are used by architects, genealogists, geographers, historians and urban planners interested in land use.
