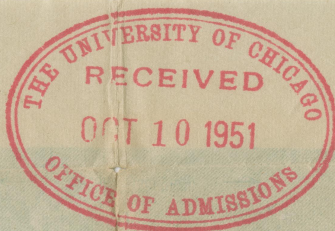

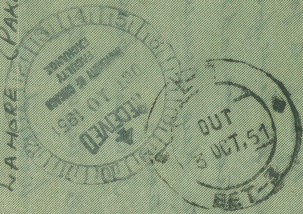

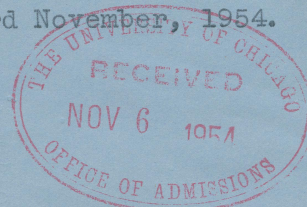

Dear Sir,

I am hoping that it will be possible to continue my studies next year in the United States, and would be most grateful for information regarding admission and scholarships to Chicago University.

At Oxford I have been reading for Honours in Chemistry and expect to obtain my degree next summer. The appointments Board has recommended a post in technical sales, which I find most attractive. Would it be possible to read courses at Chicago, perhaps in marketing, transportation, analysis of American industries, etc., which would be of considerable value to me in my prospective job?
