Nearly 180 students voted in yesterday's mock gubernato-rial election aimed at increas-ing voter turnout at the polls when Gov. Ernie Fletcher and Steve Beshear face off this No-

Fletcher received 104 votes while 75 students voted for Beshear at UK's second-ever mock election, sponsored by Student Government and the of-fice of the Kentucky Secretary of State.

Les Fugate, deputy assistant secretary of state, said the event was part of Secretary of State

Trey Grayson's civic literacy initiative and a way to get college students to pay attention to voting issues.

"In college there are a lot of demands and sometimes we forget about things outside our collegiate bubble, like elections." Fugate said. "Hopefully this will draw more attention."

Yesterday's mock election was one of a series of political activities, including the forum and a letter writing campaign, hosted by SG. Taylor Gerlach, student lobbysis copy so-chair, said the mock election was an other part of SG's goal to get students more politically involved.

"This fits in well with the other activities," Gerlach said.
"It lets people know about the upcoming election, and we had a round 30 people register (to tootle) today."

The election was a great way to promote awareness of the election, said Nate Simon, SG's deputy chief of staff for policy.


"Each activity works together or to promote the election and promote the idea that students are an important part of the political process." Simon said.

When Ben Perry realized the grass wasn't getting any greener, he conceptualized a mainstream event where any person who drives a car, buys groceries or pays bills for heating and rent could learn about sustainability.

Three years after the first Bluegrass Energy Expo, Perry has continued expanding the event to promote
a vision of living greener and more
energy efficient in Lexington.

The 2007 Bluegrass Energy and
Green Living Exposition begins to
morrow at the Lexington Center and
will feature more than 60 booths wislooking the commercial non-profit, educational
government and faith-based exhibitors
looking a sustainable community.

The expo will feature a "crusing
eleaner car show" and an art exhibit
accompanied by performances from
local musicians.

People can also visit the energy

computer software. Other attractions
include a miniature solar electric
house, and local and organic food.

The event is the only one of its

# UK missed best chance to bring down a Spurrier team

COLUMBIA, S.C. — The UK football team has already had the op-portunity to break many long streaks this year.

Steve Spurrier in 14 chances — 12 of
those beatdowns coming when he was
at Florida and the other two since he
took over at South Carolina.
Spurrier's average margin of victory when he was in charge at
Gainesville: 30 points. In two seasons
at USC, it was 17.5.

UK never stood a chance to beat
him until last night at Williams-Brice
Stadium. It was the Cat's best chance
to knock off the 'Ol Ball Coach'.
And they still couldn't pull to ff.

It's just like completely winging a The Cats won The Cats won a game over a top-10 team for the first time since 1977 when they beat Louisville. Their 5-0 start was the best since 1983. Quarterback Andre Woodson broke the record for most consecutive passes with-

test. If you have 15 multiple choice questions, chances are, you're going to get one answer right. Just one. And of those 15, this was by far UK's best chance at a win. "We definitely knew we could compete with them and possibly come away with the win." Woodson said. Spurier has always been known for throwing the ball around the field. But to do that, you must have a good quarterback.

Spurrier has a borderline-decent quarterback in redshirt freshman Chr Smelley, and he still found a way to

Smelley, and he still found a way to beat the Cats. On USC's first play from scrim-mage, Smelley had to call a timeout because he was so clueless. After the first quarter, there weren't many long pass plays called.

Spurrier won this game with a defense that forced UK to three field
goals. And with a pass rush that hurried Woodson the entire night. And
with a run defense that forced fumbles
by Cats' backs Tony Dixon and Rafael
Little.

Not only did the Cats lose the
chance of beating Spurrier for the first
time, but they lost out on several other
opportunities.

With a win, the Cats would have
moved to 6-0 for the first time since
1950, the year of their only outright
Southeastern Conference championship.

They also missed out on the opportunity to take complete control of the
SEC East. A win would have kept
them undefeated in the league, something no other team in the division

"It's extremely disappointing to be in a position to go to 2-0 in the league and now we're 1-1 and we're clearly way back in the pack," head coach Rich Brooks said.

Spurrier didn't do this alone.
Woodson came back down to earth. He had two furnbles, both returned for scores by Eric Norwood, he had a red zone interception, and he threw off his back foot several times throughout the night. He wasn't alone; the offense turned it over four times.

"You can't do that to any team and expect to win," offensive coordinator Joker Phillips said.

And you can't expect to break any more streaks.

"It's pretty disappointing, because
we definitely felt we could compete in
this game and come away with a win,"
Woodson said. "But turnovers do a lot
of damage in the game.
Woodson, who appeared to be rattled after several big hits from the
Gamecocks, was under pressure the entire night from the USC defensive line.



CHICAGO — Former New York
Mayor Rudolph Giuliani assailed Democratic Sen. Hillary Clinton on Thursday for considering a plan that would give a \$5,000 bond to the nation's newborns and suggested it could exacerbate immigration problems.

"He gave us his word that he would resign," said Sen, John Ensign, R-Nev., who's in charge of the G0P's 2008 Senate election fundraising. "I'm calling on Senator Craig to keep his word. If he loves his party, and he loves the Senate, the honorable thing to do is to resign."

Craig said in a statement that he was disappointed in Thursday's court ruling upholding his guilty plea. But he maintained his imnocence and said he Il remain in the Senate until he finishes his term in January 2009.

Craig said he intends to keep fighting to clear his name in the courts, and he added that he wants to use the Senate Ethics Committee as a forum to clear his name is momenting he can't do if he leaves the Senate.

"I will continue to serve Idaho in the United States Senate, and there are several reasons for that," Craig said in his statement. "As I continued to work for Idaho over the past three weeks here in the Senate, I have seen that it is possible for me to work here effective-ly."

On Thursday, a Minnesota judge turned down Craig's effort to withdraw his Aug. 1 guilty plea, saying that Craig's claim that he didn't know what he was doing when he pleaded guilty to disorderly conduct was "lloglead." Craig's legal team, led by high-pro-file Washington-based criminal automey Billy Martin, had no comment Thursday, Last week, Martin said Craig has "theright to pursue any and all legal remedies available as he continues the process of trying to clear his good name."

Some of Craig's colleagues, such as fellow Idaho Sen. Mike Crapo, have urged him to fight the case in court. "Senator Craig has the right to pursue his legal options as does any citizen, and I support his effort." Crapo said. "I look forward to serving with him as we continue to work on issues important to Idaho."

But Craig's decision to stay in the

— to pursue an inquiry. In a letter to Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell, R. Ky., who asked for the ethics investigation, the committee's chairwoman and vice chairman said they have the authority to look into "allegations of improper conduct which may reflect upon the Senate."

The letter, signed by Sen. Barbara Boxer, D. Calif, and vice chairman Sen. John Cornyn, R. Texas, goes on to say that typically the committee stops investigating members when they leave the Senate, but "pending Senator Craig's resignation, the committee will continue to review this matter."

McConnell had no comment Thursday, and a spokesman referred reporters to the Kentucky senator's previous statement on Craig. In early September, McConnell said he thought Craig made to consider the senator is a considerable of the senator is considerable of th






