Dear Sir:-

We have received information that the Baptist Educational Society has decided to abandon the school at Prestonsburg, and is now negotiating for a sale of that property.

I beg to advise that I gave a great deal of time and work towards securing this property for the Society at the low price at which it was purchased, as well as making a donation of \$ 500.00 or more towards securing the same. It was understood and agreed at the time that the same should be used for school purposes and the principal inducement towards securing the \$ 3500.00 of donations made to the Society was that the school would be kept in session here. For that reason I specially want to protest against any abandonment of the school, or the sale of the property to others

Further, I desire to call attention to the fact that in the Agreements between the persons making the donations and the Society it was provided that should the buildings and property cease to be used by the Society for school purposes, the divers amounts donated should be returned and repaid to the parties making such donations. In all probability this agreement has been overlooked by you, and I desire specially to call attention to the same.
