the owners of the said land, the value of the land and material sought to be condemned and taken herein for the uses and purposes of the said Big Sandy Railway Company, for the construction and operation of its line of railroad; and also to award damages, if any, resulting to the adjacent lands of the owners, considering the purposes for which it is taken, beg leave to report as follows:

After being first duly sworn by R.E. Stanley, Presiding Judge of the Floyd County Court on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of July, 1902, as more fully appears in the oath upon the order aforesaid, which order and oath are now referred to as part of this report, marked exhibit "A," we went upon the premises sought to be condemned, and the land and property of the defendant adjacent to said land, and we find and award as the value of the land so proposed to be taken by the Big Sandy Railway Company, and to be used for the purpose of constructing and operating its line of railroad, and as particularly hereinafter described, to be Eleven Hundred and Eighty Five and 30/100 (\$1185.30) Dollars, and award to the defendants, the owners of said land taken and condemned for the purposes aforesaid against the Big Sandy Railway Company, the said sum of Eleven Hundred and Eighty Five and 30/100 (\$1185.30) Dollars, as the value of the above named land.
