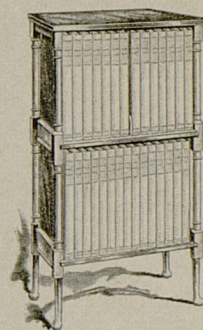

Dear Sir:-
