At this call meeting, held before the opening of the session, there were present - Pres. Patterson (in the chair) Profs Peter Purvis Clark & Linton - Honorable discharges were granted to the following named students - Percy Thomas - & Jesse Wilkins. The following comm<sup>n</sup> from the Ex. Comm: was read

1. "The Faculties of each college are charged with the oversight of the rooms on the Univ<sup>s</sup> grounds - recitation & boarding rooms, & if any clubs fail to carry out their instructions, the rooms occupied by such clubs shall be closed.
2. No student occupying any club room on said grounds, can be allowed to work elsewhere during work hours.
3. The music bands are not to be exempt from work.
4. No female cooks shall be allowed for any ~~reason~~ of the clubs on the grounds, & wash-women must get husbands or boys to get & return clothes."

Sept: 8<sup>th</sup>

Fac<sup>y</sup> met by call of Pres: Patterson at 12 o'c.  
A number of students absent at 9.00 P.M. roll call on last night were put on ligits for 20 days - Student Soursley reported for trespassing on Mr. Walter's farm - Fac<sup>y</sup> directed that his standing be reduced 10% cent & that he be publicly reprimanded in Chapel by Pres: Patterson -



Student Hopkins reported absent from quarters after 9 o'clock <sup>P.M.</sup> roll call - Fac<sup>y</sup> directed that he be put on limits for 40 days & his standing be reduced 20 per cent.

The Fac<sup>y</sup> were informed that some of the students had been muddling with the bell - They authorized Pres: Patterson, if the parties were detected, to reduce their standing 20 per cent, & put them on limits for 30 days there being no further business the Fac<sup>y</sup> adj<sup>d</sup> - Wm G. Strang Sec<sup>y</sup>

Oct: 12<sup>th</sup>

Fac<sup>y</sup> met by call of the Pres<sup>t</sup> at 3 P.M. Two communications from the Regent were read, <sup>one</sup> giving information of the absence of ~~from~~ work & citations, of students W.C. Harris D. Harris J. W. Harris & Mr. S. Vaughn, & recommending that they be required to return to their work & classes at once on penalty of dismission - another giving information on J.M. Mills for loafing &c & recommending that he be dismissed. It being ascertained that W.C. Harris, D.D. Harris had gone home <sup>without a discharge</sup> it was resolved that they be dismissed. J.W. Harris & Mr. S. Vaughn were summoned to appear before the Fac<sup>y</sup> & their case investigated - The Pres: was requested to notify them to ~~appear~~ <sup>return</sup> at once to their work & their classes on penalty of dismission.

J.M. Mills failing to obey the summons of the Fac<sup>y</sup> was dismissed - L.A. Owen for fraud & falsehood in dealings with some of his fellow students was dismissed Application from the Yost society for a change in their constitution was laid on the table Honorable discharges granted E. H. Dymond & J. G. Ogden - On motion Fac<sup>y</sup> adjourned Wm G. Strang Sec<sup>y</sup>
