

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE
Feb. 19, 1934 -

The University Senate met in the Lecture Room of McVey Hall Monday, February 19, with President McVey presiding.

The minutes of January 8 and January 24 were approved as read.

The Senate approved the recommendation of the College of Law that Law 106, Pleading I and II, Common Law and Code Pleading, four hours credit, be substituted for Law 106a and 106b, Pleading I and II, three hours each semester.

The Registrar exhibited on the blackboard some examples of the way in which the old eligibility rule worked a hardship on many students of fair ability. This was followed by a general discussion of the effects of the old and the new rules.
