On the lookout for litter in Lexington

By Susie Catchen

Tired of seeing people litter and not being able to do anything about it? A new policy has just been added to Lexington's "Let" Keep it Clean" program that allows an easy way to report people who litter. The Lexington-Fayette Environmental Commission and the Division of Police have joined forces to develop the new program to help reduce littering in Fayette County.

Fayette County.
To report someone lit-tering, you just have to fill out a postcard form, mark

it with a postage stamp and drop it in the mail. The postcards have been distributed throughout Lexington and can be found at libraries, banks, grocery stores and liquor stores. For people on campus, cards will be available at the Kernel newsroom. The cards have a space for the vehicle license number and the date, time and location of the incident.

When the Environmental Commission receives the cards, they will turn them over to the Division of Police. The police the mails the litter bugs a letter warning them that littering

is illegal and reminding them to think before throwing out their trash.
"Anyone in Fayette County seen littering can be reported. Cars that are registered outside of Fayette County can still be reported, and a letter will be sent to those offenders," said Assistant Chief Ulyses Berry of the Division of Police.
Philip Weissinger, Chairman of the Environmental Commission, helped improve the program and encouraged legal involvement.

gram and encouraginvolvement.
"We had a similar program to this and a bill was bassed at the federal level

that reduced the amount of information accessible to the public," Weissinger said. "It knocked the program out for a while but we finally got it straightened out because individuals don't have to know the name of the person they are reporting. That will be dealt with through the police department of the program will help reduce the number of people who litter, but they must assume responsibility for their actions.

"We will keep track of the program and repeat of fenders, but it is only a warning or notice program

just to notify offenders, not to pursue legal action. If an actual officer sees someome littering, they can be fined up to \$500," Berry said.

Amidst a rally of over 400 people and a slew of local and state politicians, senator and democratic vice presidential candidate Joe Lieberman arrived at Bluegrass Airport last night to begin preparation for the vice presidential debate to be held at Centre College's Norton Center for he Arts in Danville.

Welcoming the senator were Lexington's mayor Pam Miller, Governor Paul Patton and former senator Wendell Ford, among others.
Especially surprising was the large number of UK College Democrats in attendance.
"It's og ood to see so many young people coming out here and getting involved in this election," Lieberman said.

The senator expects to spend the next four days in the Lexington/Richmond area before the Centre College debate on Thursday. He plans to limit his public appearances in order to prepare for his clash with republican nominee Dick Cheney.

Among the events planned is a viewing party for the presidential debate tonight, with guest Rebecca Lieberman, the candidate's daughter.

WASHINGTON - Al Gore and George W. Bush are rehearsing for their great debates - essential practice but not to be overdone, according to candidates who have been there before. "If I had to do it again, I would not go through a Dukakis, the 1888 Democratic nominee, who faltered against Bush's father. "I think it kind of took away from my spontaneity." Neither Gore nor Bush is new at debating, but the vice president has the experience edge. He faced Republican vice presidential nominees in the 1992 and 1996 campings, in settings like those of the 2000 debates that begin tomorrow in Boston.

Gunmakers' appeal is rejected

WASHINGTON — Two gunmakers who chalenged Congress' authority to ban the manufacture, sale and possession of semiautomatic assault weapons lost a Supreme Court appeal yesterday. The court, without comment, rejected an appeal by Navegar Inc. and Penn Arms Inc. that said Congress exceeded its power to regulate interstate commerce when it outhawed such weapons.

What does he advocate? Galbraith said individuals can boycott products of sweat-shops. Students are the future workforce, and he says they are the ones who can make a differ-ence in this issue.



Students: beware of rising popularity of club drugs

Although club drugs may be fairly wen to the Lexington party and club scene, they already have made their mark.

During June 23:25, eight people who overdosed on GHB (gamma-hydroxybutyrate) were taken to the UK Hospital. One man died and a woman Kinswing the effects and risks associated with club drugs could make the difference between life and death, said Ruth Staten, Ph.D. substance abuse specialist with the University Health Service and associate professor in the UK College of Nursing.

Club drugs can cause serious health problems and, when combined with alcohol in some cases, be fatal. Since most club drugs are doorless and colorless, it is nearly impossible to determine whether they have been added to your drink. In recent year, perpetuators have slipped club drugs are perpetuators have slipped club drugs are perpetuators have slipped club drugs are commit sexual assault. University Health Service officials recommend that you be aware of the environment when attending parties or clubs.

"Any time you buy a drug from some place other than a pharmacy, you cannot be sure what you are getting," Staten said. "When these drugs are taken alone, mixed with other drugs or alcohol, you never know what response they will have on your body."
