## Snowgasbord!

Eighteen inches of snow center of confusing week

Nothing like a Friday without school.

University officials elected to cancel classes after Mother Nature dumped more snow on UK, further burying students' cars and making walking on campus a tad difficult.

Even all-night work by Physical Plant crews, who staggered shifts the last two days and nights, could barely keep the flakes off the streets and walkways on Thursday and Friday.

Friday.

While campus was clear enough for classes to resume Thursday, "There wasn't any way the grounds crew could keep up with that (Fridays nowfall)," said Ben Carr, assistant to the president for Administrative Affairs.

"Trying to find a place to put the snow is a problem," said Jack Applegate, head of Physical Plant Division. "We've looked for corners and triangles and some parking spaces, curbs."

Applegate said he is not concerned about the warm temperatures causing water main breaks, potholes and flooding.

In fact, "because (snow's) so thick, it really helps to insulate things underground," said Carr, who said he was not aware of any power

Carr, who said he was not aware of any power outages occurring on campus.
Physical Plant has about 15 plows it uses to clear snow, as well as converted mowers that have brushes on to clear the walkways. As in previous years, UK called in a contractor to clean around Commonwealth Stadium and the big parking lots, Applegate said.
Plant workers also helped clear side streets, such as Woodland and Columbia avenues, which have gone nearly untouched by the city plows.

UK announced on its information line, its web page and all television and radio news stations Wednesday night that classes were delayed one hour to give students more time to make it to Central Campus.

Resident advisers made hall-wide announcements and posted signs to inform students of the verdict.

Carr, Applegate, Lt. Henry Huff of Lexington Police and Patrick Kass from UK Parking and Transportation Services all met at 5:30 Thursday morning in the Old Board Room of the Administration Building to decide.

Administrators said waiting until the morning is the best way because they know all the facts, said Lloyd Axelrod, director of UK Public Relations.

## **SGA** president stipulations may rise

Government Association are rushing to pass a bill before this spring's election that would alter the requirements for running.

alter the requirements for run-ning.
A prospective candidate for SGA president needs 350 signa-tures to reach the ballot. A pro-posed constitutional amendment would increase that number to 1,000.

The amendment would also require those running for senator at large to get the signatures of at least 400 constituents.

Other senatorial candidates would have to present the signatures of 25 members of their college or 3 percent, whichever is greater, said George Myers, the College of Social Work senator who originally proposed the bill.

Freshmen senatorial candidates would have to show the signatures of 3 percent of the freshmen class, and Lex-

ington Community College candidates would have to present the signatures of 3 percent of the constituency at LCC, Myers said.

He said the bill should get more students involved in SGA.

The whole goal of this bill is to get the student body and student government as one," Myers said.

dent government as one," Myers said.

He said the change could increase voter turnout at the elections and create a sense of responsibility among SGA members.

"If 1,000 people hear your platform, it will give those 1,000 people the opportunity to tell you what they want you to do," Myers said.

He said students will be more comfortable with their representatives in SGA and come back to them with requests for action in the senate.

"You feel like you have ownership in my office because you put me there," Myers said.

But the bill has not been met without objection.

Most of the senators opposing the bill oppose the extra work the signature requirement adds, said SGA President Melanic Cruz.

"If you don't want to do the work, don't run for an office," she said. "Holding an office she said with a supposition of the work of the said o

If you don't want to do the work, don't run for office. Holding an office is very demanding." Myers said some dissenters believe candidates from the College of Arts and Sciences would have trouble finding students to sign their peti-

He countered their argument saying that in large colleges like Arts and Sciences, candidates can find plenty of groups to address, and they could even walk up to students on the sidewalk for signa-

"He's really given us a big lift," Smith aid. "He's been playing well in practice for about a month now and with Scott out, he had a lot more opportunities to play."

## Virtual U. offers education from distance

#### CPE looking for avenues to link schools

When the word "virtual" comes up in conversation, it usually refers to high technology.

The Distance Learning Advisory Committee of the Kentucky's Council on Postsecondary Education is now working on the Commonwealth Virtual University.

"It has all of the components of higher education, except the professor and student are not in the same place," said Larry Fowler, director of special programs for the council.

The goal of the committee "is to provide recommendation to the CPE. regarding long-distance learning initiatives and policies," said, Merl Hackbart, council and committee member, and UK professor of business and economics.

"The Commonwealth Virtue and University encompasses many of the activities that would ordinarily be considered long-distance learning," Hackbart said.
"The virtual university isn't a technical issue. It's more of a policy issue. The technology just

allows it to happen," said Lee Todd, committee chairman and council member, who taught engineering at UK for eight years.

Todd is also the chief executive officer of Databeam, a Lexington company that writes libraries and toolkits used in developing teleconferencing software, as well as some teleconferencing software isself. "The central question is, What will the Commonwealth Virtual University look like?" Todd said.

An example of a virtual university is the Phoenix University, a national corporation that began as a correspondence school. Students take Phoenix classes in their various communities, and while there is no central campus, students get their education from the Phoenix University,

whether they attended classes in Lexington or Los Angeles.

"If our traditional universities don't position themselves to be offering education at the desktop, they will lose out to for-profit institutions," Todd said.

The Commonwealth Virtual University isn't about removing the autonomy from the various schools in Kentucky, but rather allowing people better access to higher education, Todd said.
"Many university presidents see distance learning as a threat to their traditional universities, but I see it as reaching new populations," Todd said.

George Connick, the Maine Educational Network president, spoke recently to the committee

about Maine's distance learning programs.

About 90 percent of the students using distance learning in Sought continuing education, Connick said. UK already provides some distance learning services, such as televised classes and some teleconferencing.

"Traditional universities are provider driven, but this is more client-driven," said Todd, who added that the virtual university allows a student to tailor his or her they want to learn.

The committee is currently studying other virtual universities.

The committee is currently studying other virtual universities. In November, a team of council members went to Colorado to study

the Western Governor's Union.
"We're trying to learn as much
as we can from people who have
already done this," Todd said.

al we can from people with a laready done this," Todd said.

Other issues the committee will look it include financial aid, accessibility and advising and accessibility and advising and counseling.

Hackbart said the committee's report to the council on March 8 will be a progress report and will address some of these issues.

The Commonwealth Virtual University "will improve efficiency in postsecondary education delivery and will give our students access to educational opportunities that they might not otherwise have," Hackbart said.

"I was in a three bedroom apartment with six guys," Wegner said. "Because the money for rent was taken out of our paychecks, we were left with 100 dollars a week to live on after working a 40-hour work week.

"Needless to say I'm in a lot of debt now, but it was worth it," Wegner said. "I would have done it for free, and I think that a lot of people felt the same way."

## **Survey by UK center** finds state still smokes

Despite intense anti-smoking campaigns, 2 percent more Kentuckians have been smoking in the last five years, a UK survey found.

Created on the national and state advertising levels, along with general public relations programs, these anti-smoking campaigns were begun, in large part, to fight the tobacco advertising campaigns designed to allure younger smokers.

But young people, though they can be part of the next generation of smokers, aren't the only ones smoking. Adults are most affected by the consequences of smoking. And as that action has become increasingly oppular among women over the last 30 years, that demographic has increased by 400 percent in more smokers.

gett said. "Somebody just kneed me in my back where it was hurting and that twisted it. I got a knot here and here (pointing to the lower right side of his back). That really hur and it just made it tough to run."

Padgett's called the injury a "day-to-day" thing and did not expect to be out for a prolonged amount of time.

But he wasn't the only one feeling the effects of an injured back. Only seven days after his 31-point performance against Florida, UK guard Cameron Mills did not play at all because of back spasms.

"It seems like there's an epidemic going on," UK head coach Tubby Smith said.

Mills' back has been bothering him for the past two days. He didn't practice on Friday or Saurady but said he could have played yesterday if needed.



Unfortunately, Belush has since passed away, as has Landis' ability to write and direct effectively.

Although they've had 18 years to think of a premise for a sequel, it seems more like Landis and Aykroyd thought up this movie in about 18 minutes. Blues Brothers 2000 basically has no story. The movie's just a big melting pot of scenes stolen from the original, celebrity cameos and a few dance numbers thrown in to fill gaping plot holes.

The so-called story consists of Aykroyd just being released from prison for his antics in the first film. Once again, but this time for no apparent reason whatsoever, Aykroyd decides to 'get the band back together.' So just like the original, Aykroyd goes about rounding up the old gang, with the addition of an unbelievably annoying little kid, a barrender (John Goodman), and a black cop (Joe Morton) who Aykroyd claims is his half-brother.

Of course during this search, Landis throws in another rendi-

Aykroyd made a career out of playing straight men to great comedians like Tom Hanks, Bill Murray and Chevy Chase, but by himself he just isn't very funny. What made the Blues Brothers so original was that they were both, in a way, playing the straight man. Their deadpan expressions and delivery were perfect, but in this sequel Aykroyd's character, other than the hat, sunglasses and suit, bears no resemblance to the Elwood Blues of the original.

In the end, Blues Brathers 2000 stands as nothing more than a fee-ble attempt by Aykroyd and Landisto revive their sagging careers by capitalizing on their previous successes. However, all they do sliggrace the movie that showed both of these once talented entertainers at their best.

No matter what, do not see this movie.




