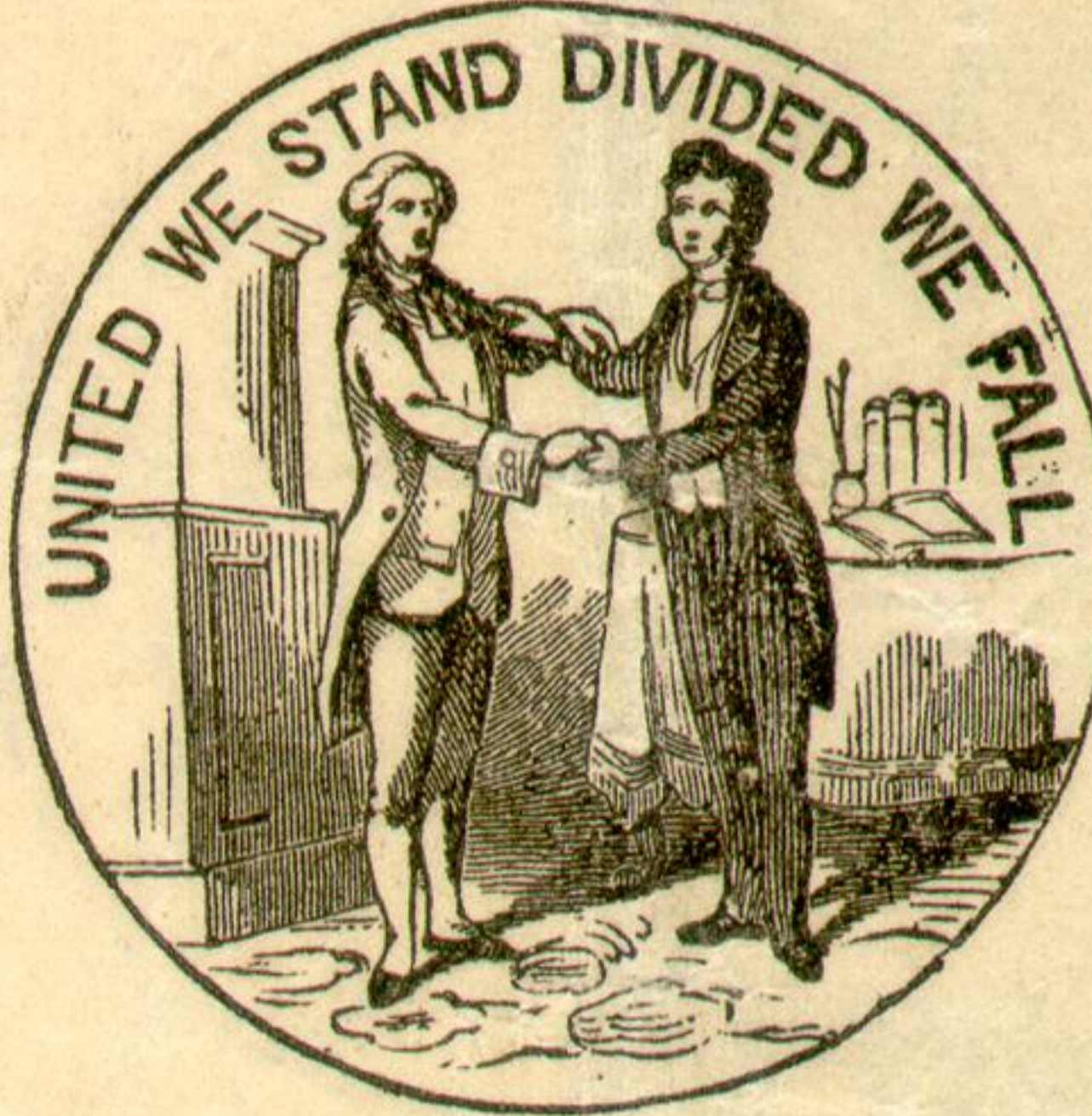


# TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE

### EXPLANATIONS

General Average is made on the eight Common School Branches, viz: Spelling, Reading, Writing, Geography, Arithmetic, Grammar, History, and Composition, but may be modified by other evidences of professional ability. The scale of gradation is 100. A per centage of 75 entitles a Teacher to a First Grade First Class Certificate; a per centage of 60 to a Second Grade First Class Certificate; and a per centage of 50 to a Second Class Certificate.
