Gore says Clinton ticket 'bridge to future'

Basketball, Two Keys highlight Friday's speech

Chants of "four more years" and shouts of "We love you Al" welcomed Vice President Al Gore to the Student Center Grand Ballroom Friday afternoon.

Though the vice president did not dance the Macarena, the approximate 1,000 in attendance pumped up for his speech to the likes of "Tootsie Roll" and "Closer to Free."

Gore's visit, co-sponsored by the Student Government Association and the UK Young Democrats through the Clinton/Gore General Committee, drew a crowd of mainly students and also state democratic leaders, including Gov. Paul Patton, Louisville Mayor Jerry Abramson and State Representative Ernesto Scorsone.

Melanie Cruz, SGA executive director, introduced Gore, citing the importance of student involvement in education through the upcoming election.

"Education is a serious issue. It's not an issue just for Republicans or Democrats," Cruz said. "It's an issue for students."

In his address, Gore focused on what the Clinton administration has done for students and on statistics released from the Census Bureau showing growth in economic development.

The vice president said his party brings a "bridge to the future."

"The principle component to that bridge to the future."

"The principle component to that bridge to the future is education," Gore said. "For some in America, if you have to rely on your own family finances, you won't go to college."

Gore said he and Clinton supported easier access to student loans. An annothing funding of Pell Gores and the consumer of the propertion of

ollege.

Gore also highlighted recent statistics from the ensus Bureau that show "the largest drop in poverty

Census Bureau that show "the largest drop in poverty in 26 years."

He said the average household income rose by \$2,461 in Kentucky, and average income also rose nationally for the first time in six years. Poverty rates among blacks fell to their lowest level in history also. "We've seen the biggest closing of the income gap in 27 years," Gore said. "The economic growth rate in our country went up to 4.7 percent."

Normally economic growth is accompanied by increased inflation. But the 60 percent deficit reduction during the Clinton administration prevented inflation from cutting into economic gains, Gore said. "We have reduced the deficits four years in a row, and that is the first time that has happened in a presi-

dent's term in 152 years," Gore said.

"Because of that, we can have more growth in our economy and more jobs in our economy without triggering inflation and without driving interest rates up."

up."

Gore credited Democrats with cutting taxes, protecting the environment and maintaining government funding for Medicare and education. He said his "competitors" rely on the past, rather than make changes for the future.

Core knew his audience well. His speech referred to UK, Tolly Ho, Two Keys Tavern, and the national championship baskeball team.

He spoke of the team's visit to the White House when he was reduced to being a spectator.

"If I'm lucky someone will see me alone in the cor-


The top four candidates who will be Freshman Senators are Masten Childers, Katie Queen, Rachel Bomberger and Andee McElya.

Top vote-getter Masten Childers received 115 votes.





Couch turned to Gator bait in first-ever start

GAINESVILLE, Fla. — The moment UK football fans had been waiting for finally happened Saturday.

No, the Cats didn't come close to beating top-ranked Florida on this day, losing 65-0 in front of \$5,422 rabid Gator fans at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium at Florida Field.

The moment came with 13:57 left in the first quarter, when the starting offense trotted out for its first series.

There leading the way for UK was "The Deuce," Tim Couch.

After three games serving as Billy Jack Haskins' understudy, was time for the freshman to make his first collegiate start.

But the Gators were uncooperative to Couch, as he only completed 6-of-18 passes for 13 yards.

He also threw his first collegiate interception in the second quarter, as he was picked off by Florida cornerback Fred Weary.

"I don't think I was nervous or anything just kind of out of the rhythm for some reason," Couch said. "I don't know what the reason was."

with the way the rest of the team played would not be fair," UK coach Bill Curry said. "He did have some open passes and had some real good protection that we weren't able to hit. He also made some good throws.

"But it seemed we were out of sync from the very beginning and it wasn't a good day for either of our quarterbacks," Curry said.

The decision to start the freshman was made early in the week, Curry said, but he did not tell the media about it in order to take some of the pressure off Couch.

"I promised our whole team, Tim and Billy Jack, that when I felt like one of them had a better chance for us to win than the other, I'd start them," Curry said.

"And I felt like the way Tim has been throwing the ball, he'd give us a better chance."

"We were thoroughly dominated," UK coach Bill Curry said. "We didn't do anything well. Florida is an outstanding football team, but we didn't give ourselves a chance to try and measure up to them."

To put the Cats' offensive output in perspective, Florida amassed 78 yards, on its first drive. Whether it was through the air or on the ground, UK couldn't get it together.

With freshman Tim Couch making his first start, there was optimism that the Wildcat passing game would open up, but it didn't. Instead, the Cats had their worst passing game of the season, throwing for a toral of 43 yards.

The UK running attack was not much better. It was led by Ray McLaurin who rushed for 34 yards on 13 attempts.

"It seemed that we were out of sync from the very beginning," Curry said. "It wasn't a good day for either of our quarterbacks."

Despite the second lowest offensive yardage allowed by any Gator defense, Florida coach Steve Spurrier wasn't the least bit impressed with the shutout.

"We're not making a big deal out of this," Spurrier said. "Kentucky scored three points against Indiana last week, and they have not scored a whole bunch this year, sow e've got to keep that in perspective.

"They don't throw the ball very well," he said, "so

With the output, UK will no doubt slip back to the rank as the absolute worst offense in Division 1-A college football, a position it had held prior to the Indiana game, before North Texas claimed it for the past week.

The Cats seem confident despite the bleak past, and the bleaker future, which still includes trips to such powerhouses as Alabama (this Saturday), LSU and Tennessee.

"We know we're gonna get back on Monday, go for broke and do the best we can to get our team back on the right page," said center Jason Watts, "because we're all just misfiring right now."




