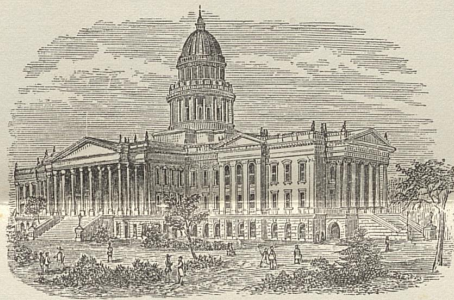

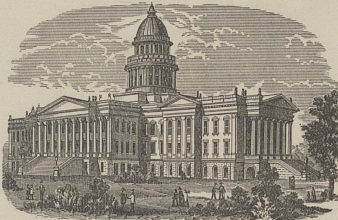
If accepted, please send written notice of acceptance to this office for record; remitting at the same time the fee of One Dollar as prescribed by law.
