September 23^d

The Faculty met in called session at 9 o'clock A.M.
 Pres. J. N. Patterson, Prof. Herron and Shackelford and Adj. Prof. White were present.
 Mr. E. D. Marshall, a matriculate of this College last session, asked permission to board at Woodlands and enter the labor department. Prof. Herron's motion to grant him the desired permission as long as he should conduct himself properly was not seconded. Prof. Shackelford offered a resolution protesting against Mr. Marshall being admitted into this College on account of his bad conduct last session. This motion was carried and the Sec. was directed to send a copy of the resolution to Regent Bowman.

October 3^d

The Faculty met at the usual time and place.
 There were present Pres. Patterson, Prof. Shackelford, Col. Swigert, Mr. Dean, Superintendent of the farm, and Adj. Prof. White.
 Messrs Adams and Sullivan were excused from drill.
 The request of Messrs Fleece, Davidson, and C. E. Muni-weather to be excused from drill was refused.
 Mr. C. V. Dacey and one or two others asked to be excused from drill, stating that Regent Bowman promised them at the time of their matriculation that they would be exempt from drill. Being satisfied that it would be indiseret to excuse these boys from drill, it was resolved not to excuse them for the present. Prof. Shackelford and

Col. Swigert were appointed a committee to ascertain to what extent Regent Downings had committed himself in regard to the drilling of these boys.

At the suggestion of Mr. Dean the boys in the labor department were excused from daily drill and were required to drill every Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock.
