The business of the meeting - the report of the committee on Entrance Examinations - was taken up. The report was read as a whole. Prof. Miller moved an amendment that had been suggested by Prof. White, who was not present - The Amendment no. 14. read as follows: That that the State be divided into several districts and one of these be assigned to each professor in the College to be worked up.

After some discussion and an indecisive vote, farther consideration of this amendment was postponed until the next meeting. The report as read was adopted with a few slight verbal changes. (See No. 15 file P.)

The faculty adjourned to meet Wed. Mar. 18 - to consider Prof. White's amendment and the names of those ^{who are} candidates for degrees.
