ATHLETICS AT KENTUCKY

Kentucky's athletic program, a well-balanced and ambitious activity featuring intercollegiate competition in ten different sports, is organized under the Department of Athletics and a corporation known as the University of Kentucky Athletics Association.

The program is conducted without overemphasis or sacrifice of educational objectives and in strict compliance with the rules of the University, the Southeastern Conference and the National Collegiate Athletics Association.

A board of directors, headed by the President of the University in the capacity of chairman, maintains over-all policy supervision of the athletic program.

In addition to the UK President, board officers include the Vice-President for Student Affairs as vice-chairman and Dr. W. L. Matthews in the capacity of secretary. Fourteen other men, drawn from the University faculty and the general public, also serve on the board as appointees of the president as do two student representatives.

Supervising the steady growth and balanced development of the athletic program is Athletic Director Harry C. Lancaster.

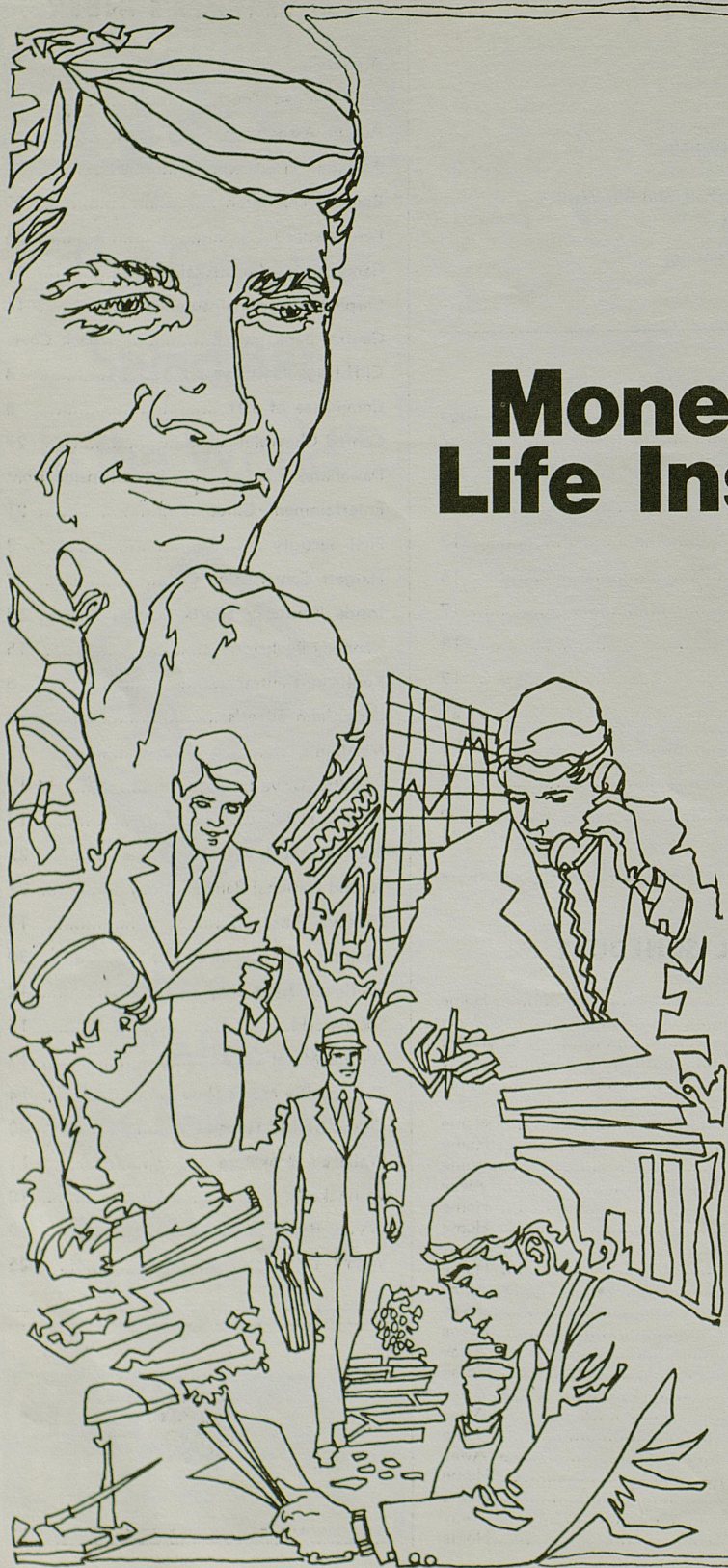

WENDELL H. FORD was elected as Kentucky's governor in November, 1971, after having served a four-year term as lieutenant governor. A native of Owensboro, he is a veteran of World War II and attended the University of Kentucky before graduating from the Maryland School of Insurance. He has been a member of the President's Council on Youth Fitness, National Council for Religion in American Life, Kentucky Council of Education and the Second Army Advisory Committee. A very active Jaycee in his earlier years, he was director, vice president and president of the Owensboro Jaycees and vice president and president of the National Jaycees and vice president of the North American Jaycees. He has represented the Eighth District in the Kentucky Senate and was chief assistant to Gov. Bert Combs in 1959-61.

PRESIDENT OTIS A. SINGLETARY came to Lexington in August, 1969, from the University of Texas, Austin, where he was executive vice chancellor for academic affairs. Dr. Singletary, who is eighth president of the University, served a total of eight years at Texas, progressing during seven (1954-61) of those years from instructor to professor, associate dean of Arts and Sciences and assistant to the president. Then for five years (1961-66), he was chancellor of the University of North Carolina, although he was on leave from October 1964 to January 1966 to serve as director of the Job Corps, Office of Economic Opportunity.

HARRY C. LANCASTER was named acting Athletics Director at U.K. in September 1968 and permanent AD three months later. He previously had been associated with Adolph Rupp since 1946 and remained as Rupp's chief assistant until the end of the 1968-69 season. A native of Paris, he is a graduate of Georgetown College with a master's degree from U.K.

JOE B. HALL

Head Coach

Joe B. Hall returns as head coach of the Wildcats after a break-in year in which his team won 20 of 28 games, retained its UKIT title, repeated as SEC champion, advanced to the Mideast Regional Finals, and earned for him the 1972-73 SEC Basketball Coach-of-the-Year title, and Coach and Athlete Magazine's Southeast Coach-of-the-Year, honors no other rookie coach has attained since the league was formed in 1933.

The honors were nothing new to Hall, who has made a habit of gathering such accolades during a coaching career that began at Shepherdsville (Ky.) High School in 1956 and continued through Regis College and Central Missouri State College before he returned to Lexington July 1, 1965, as an assistant to his old coach Adolph Rupp.

During his two-year term at Shepherdsville, Hall guided the Cougars to Mid-Kentucky Conference titles and was named "Coach-of-the-Year" in 1958. Moving into the collegiate field, he served one year as freshman coach and five years as head basketball coach at Regis in Denver, Colo., where he was also athletic director and earned special recognition as coach of the champion independent team in the area.

He coached Central Missouri (1964-65) to a 19-6 season and the Mules' first MIAA Conference championship since 1951, and to their first conference Christmas Tournament title in history. The string of coaching honors continued as he was named MIAA Coach-of-the-Year for 1964-65.

While at Regis, he coached the Capital Federal Denver host team in the 1964 AAU tournament and was selected as head coach of the AAU Stripes in the Olympic Trials at Jamaica, N.Y. He helped conduct basketball clinics for the U.S. Army in Anchorage and Fairbanks, Alaska, in 1968, was Olympic Trials coach under Hank Iba at the Air Force Academy in Colorado in July 1972 and is a member of the 1976 Olympic Basketball Committee.

A native of Cynthiana, Ky., he lettered three years in basketball and football and was captain of both sports during his senior year

in high school there. He played freshman basketball and one year of varsity basketball in the "Fabulous Five" era at the University before transferring to The University of the South at Sewanee, Tenn., where he set a school single game scoring record and was team captain. Coach Lon Varnell, upon retirement, rated Hall as No. 1 of the three best players he ever coached.

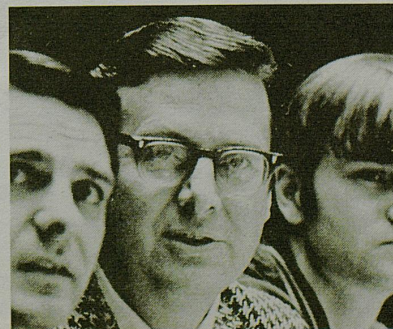
After touring Europe with the Harlem Globetrotters in 1951, Hall returned to the University of Kentucky in 1955 to complete requirements for his B.A. and later (1964) received his M.A. at Colorado State University.

He returned to the University again in 1965 as assistant coach, scout and head recruiter, and was instrumental in adopting a running-conditioning program which obviously paid huge dividends as the Wildcats capitalized on blazing speed and endurance to offset a lack of size and advance to the championship game of the NCAA Finals. Following that season, he successfully recruited six prep All-Americans, including Dan Issel, Kentucky's all-time scoring leader, to form the nucleus of a varsity team that won three straight conference championships, to be followed by three more consecutive championships for six in a row since he signed that first "crop" for the University.

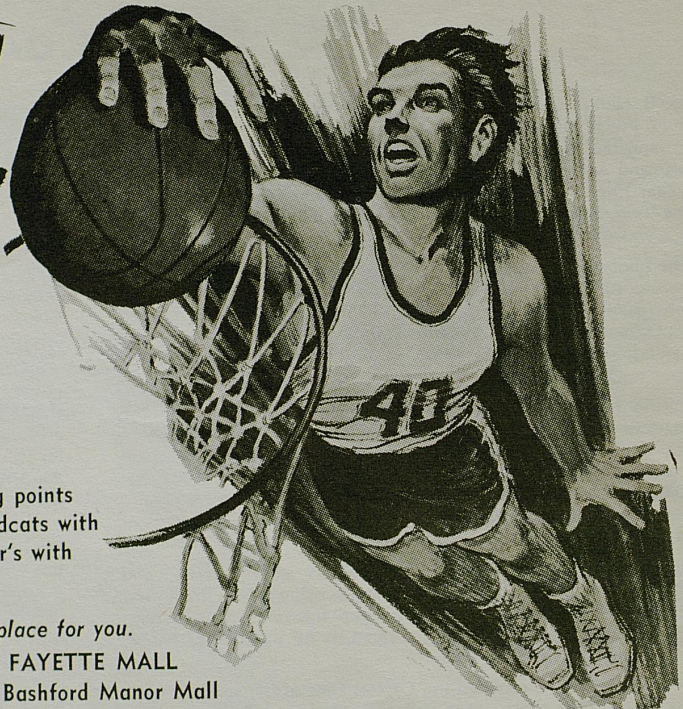
When Harry C. Lancaster was named permanent athletic director Feb. 1, 1969, Hall became No. 1 varsity assistant and head freshman coach. His record with the Frosh was 60-15, including an undefeated (22-0) season (1971-72), which resulted in the Kittens being crowned National Freshman Champions by the Basketball News.

During his first season as head coach, the Wildcats were virtually counted out of the race after suffering four early conference losses. They won their last nine for the University's sixth SEC title in a row and 28th since the league was formed.

Hall is married to the former Katharine Dennis of Harrison County, Ky. They have three children—Judy 17; Kathy, 16, and Stephen, 13.

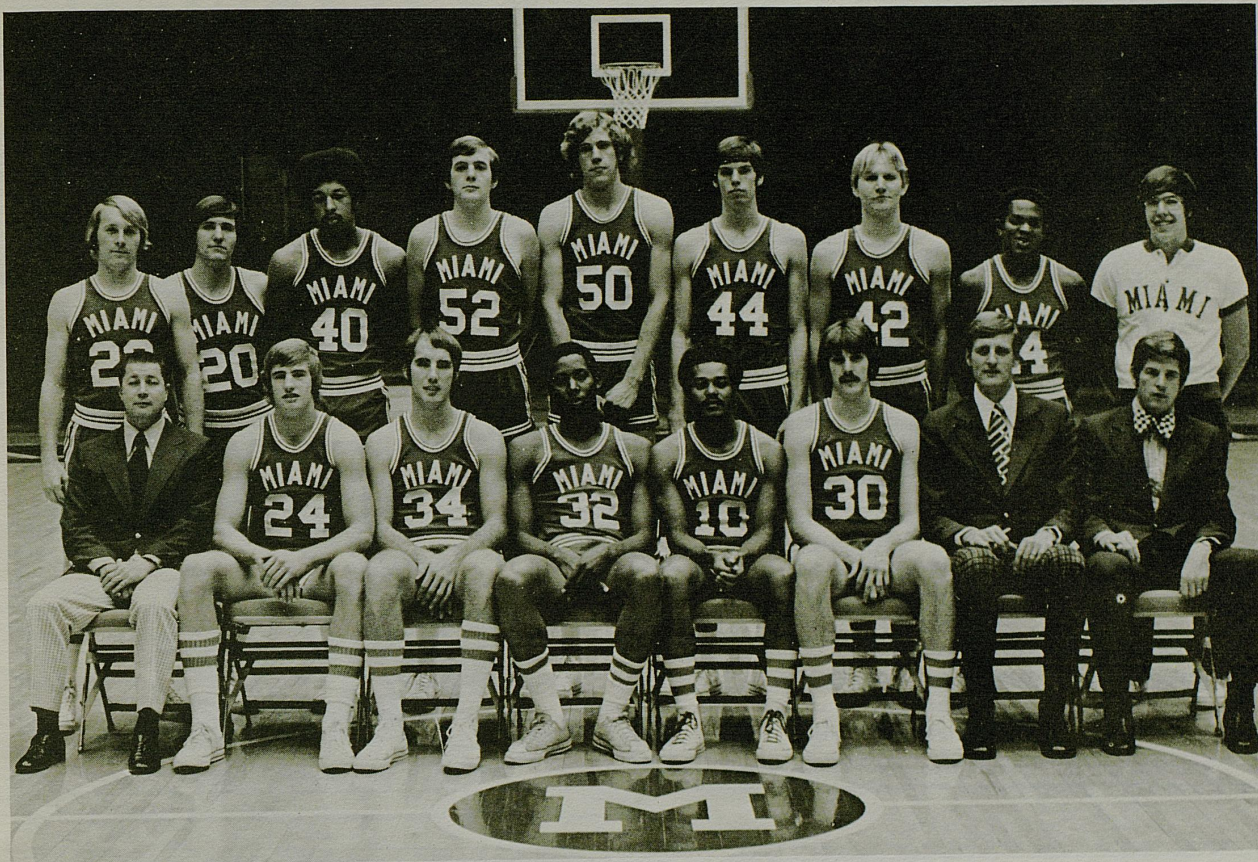

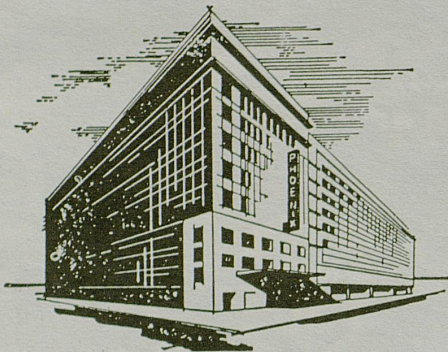

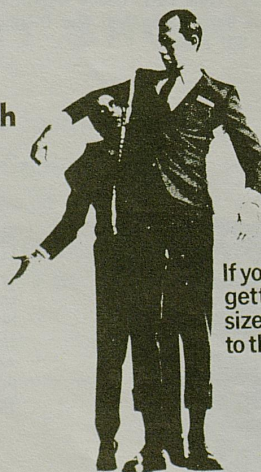

WILDCAT COACHING ASSISTANTS



DICK PARSONS
Assistant Coach

Beginning his second year as head assistant and junior varsity coach, Parsons' talent and effervescent approach to the game is one reason for the Wildcats' success last year. A dedicated and vigorous worker, he faced a bleak JV season last year with only three scholarship freshmen, but he stuck with them and saw their development advance to a point where all three will contribute this year to the varsity program. He has been in service to the University first as an outstanding athlete, and secondly as an excellent coach.

In accepting the position of junior varsity coach and No. 1 varsity assistant, he was forced to give up his job as UK's head baseball coach. His association with baseball had been a source of great pleasure and accomplishment both in playing and coaching ranks. Upon becoming baseball coach in 1969, Parsons worked diligently to upgrade the program with youthful athletes big on desire. He molded a team his second year which established or tied 15 school records. He recruited to his needs, and left the program on solid ground. Parsons came to UK from the mountains of Eastern Kentucky. At Harlan High, he was a four-sports star, and scored 1,277 points during a three-year basketball career. At Kentucky, he became known for his quickness and alert defensive play as well as a fine outside shooter. A three-year starter at guard, his career high point production of 21 came against Mississippi his sophomore year.

He was recipient of the coveted A. B. Chandler award, given annually to the player best exemplifying the qualities of leadership, scholarship, character and ability, in 1960 and 1961. He holds the distinction of serving as captain in two varsity sports—basketball and baseball. He holds more school baseball records than any other player. He was an All-SEC shortstop in 1959 and 1961; All-NCAA District, 1960, '61, and All-American 1961. He hit 400 his senior year. After graduation, he was an assistant in football at Glasgow High School two years and baseball and basketball coach at Boyle County High School from 1963 to 1968. While working on his Master's Degree at the University in 1968-69, he scouted, recruited and helped with the Wildcat freshman team. He later accepted a part-time assistantship in basketball in addition to his baseball job. He is known as one of the finest scouts in the country, with a particular knack for spotting opponents' weaknesses and setting up an attack to exploit their deficiencies.

He is married to the former Celia Cawood of Harlan. They have one daughter, Kathy, seven, and a son, Ed, 10.



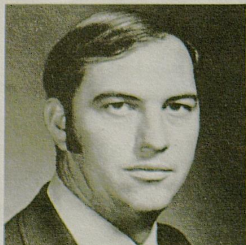
BOYD GRANT
Assistant Coach

Hired as chief recruiter in addition to regular coaching duties, Grant's contribution to Kentucky basketball has had a great impact on the players themselves. A defensive fundamentalist who demands perfection and usually gets it, he has successfully instilled a sense of pride and enthusiasm in defensive drills. An assistant coach at Colorado State University for 10 years, Grant became the final member of Coach Hall's staff July 1, 1972.

Born Aug. 17, 1933, in Bancroft, Idaho, Grant lettered in basketball, football, and baseball at Snow Junior College, Utah, in 1954. He was a forward on the National Junior College Tournament runner-up team. He transferred to Colorado State University in 1954, completing three years varsity competition in which he earned letters in basketball and baseball. He was All-Skyline Conference in basketball in 1956 and 1957, and served as team captain his senior year. He earned his B.S. in Physical Education from CSU in 1957, and M.S. in Education in 1962.

After a two-year hitch in the Army Signal Corps, he became head basketball, football, and track coach at Mountain View High School in Wyoming for two years. His basketball teams twice were runners-up in the Class B State Tournament. He joined the Colorado State staff in 1961 as varsity assistant basketball coach and freshman baseball coach, remaining in that category until 1965. Grant served as acting head basketball coach the '65-66 season, leading the Rams to a 15-7 record and a berth in the NCAA tournament. He served as head freshman and varsity assistant coach from 1966 to '72, when his freshman teams compiled a 71-33 record. He was active in amateur basketball until three years ago, and even now is considered one of the best shooters around. He often engages in shooting matches with team members who have shooting problems, demonstrating as well as teaching them to improve their technique.

Grant is married to the former Glenna Groom of American Falls, Idaho. They have two daughters, Leslie, 15; Lori, 10, and a son, Kevin, 1.



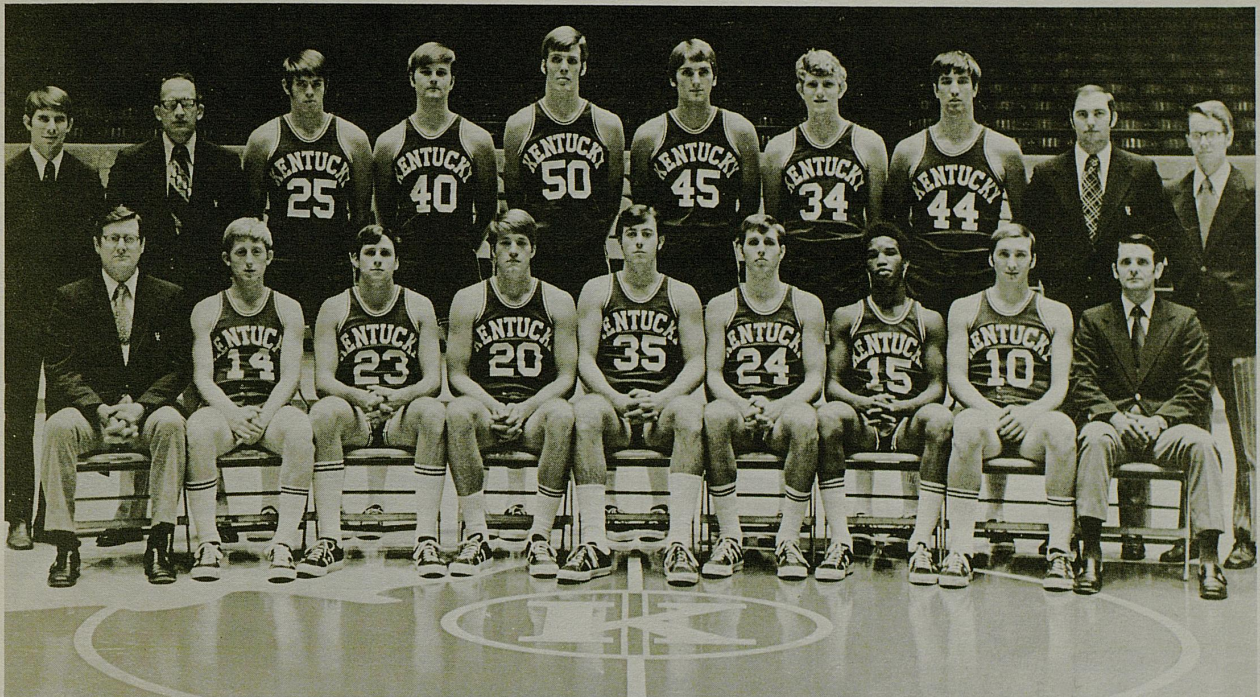
JIM HATFIELD

Now in his second year at the University, Hatfield is continuing to work with recruiting and scouting. During his first year with the Wildcats, he also directed the pre-season conditioning program. He came to the University after serving as an assistant coach and chief recruiter for small college basketball power Birmingham-Southern College from 1970-72.

A native of Knoxville, he played basketball from 1958 to 1961 at Fulton High, was captain of the 1961 team and earned honors as most valuable player, best rebounder and best defensive player. He played as a freshman at the University of Tennessee before transferring to East Tennessee State University, where he played varsity basketball three years and graduated with a B.S. Degree in Business Administration.

After working in a sales management program with International Harvester's Motor Truck Division, he served with the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve. Before accepting a position with Birmingham-Southern, he was head basketball coach at Lyman High School, Orlando, Fla., from 1962 to 1970. He earned his Master's Degree in School Administration with a minor in physical education from the University of Montevallo, Ala.

He is married to the former Lana Murdock of Orlando, Fla. They have one daughter, Angela Jean.
