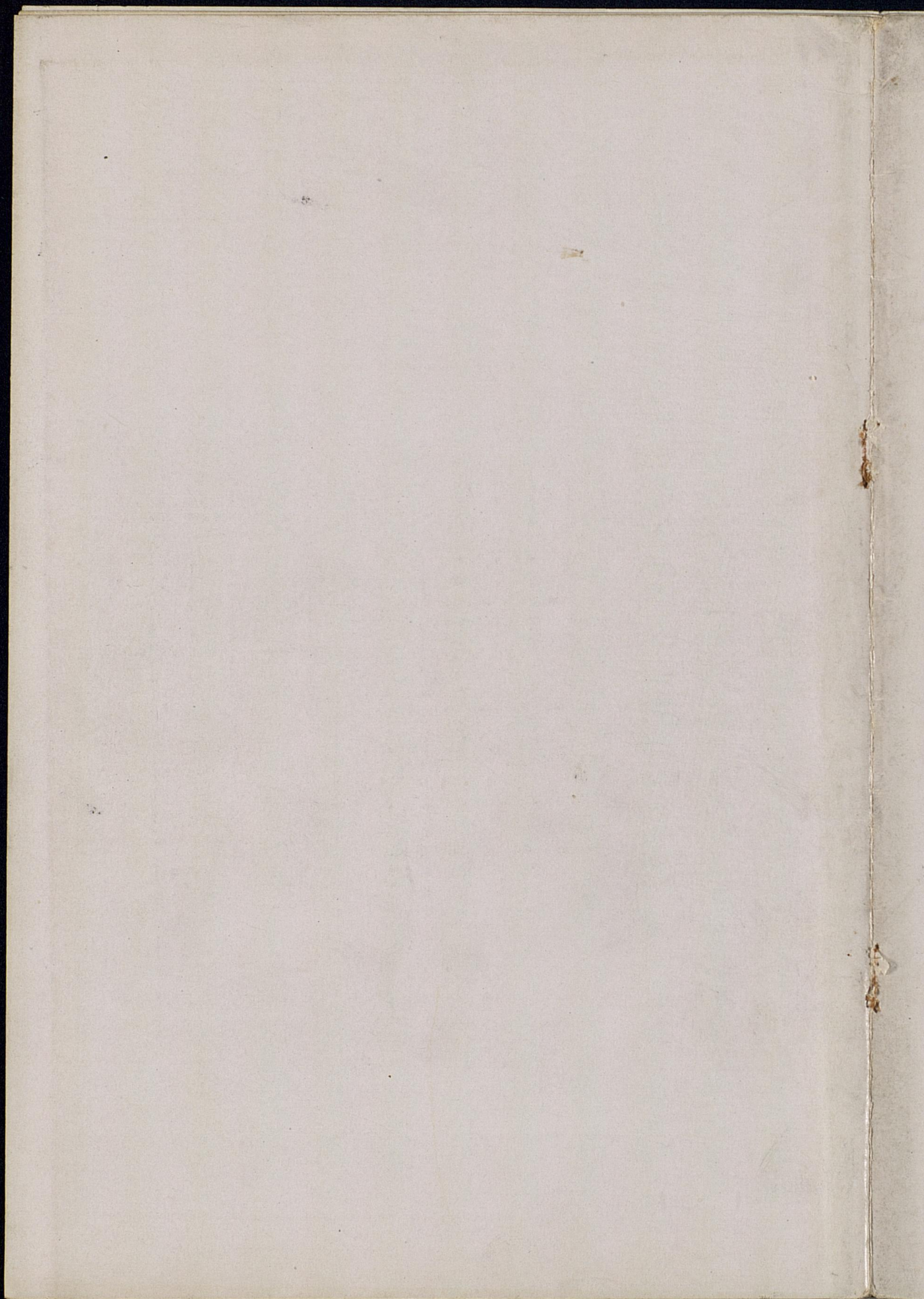

SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

FOREWORD

The public has been generous with us and has shown us high confidence. In return we lay before the public a complete accounting of all our affairs. Of the more than fifty thousand dollars given us in the brief two years of our existence, four-fifth, or over forty thousand, has come in during this second year. We have engaged a statistician to tabulate our expenditures in relation to the work accomplished so that we, as well as our supporters, will better understand the data we are keeping with painstaking care.

Meanwhile, even a brief study of this Report brings out a few striking conclusions:

- (1) Kentucky, both in the number of the subscribers and in the total subscribed, has given more than any other state for this National Demonstration located within her borders..
- (2) Except for a few hundred dollars the surplus funds are all designated for building purposes and must be so applied. Each center constructed and opened enlarges the scope of our Demonstration and increases the budget. We need hundreds more of small subscribers to cover current expenses. This is what is meant by public support. Will not you who read, and have not already subscribed, become one of these?
- (3) The nursing work has been done in spite of flood after flood during a winter of high water. The Director's work has been handicapped by loss of time due to serious illness for many weeks. The officers of the Kentucky Committee have had to face perplexing questions arising out of these conditions. Will our friends please bear all this in mind as they scan the following pages?
