

1948 PROSPECTS

What will fortune bring Paul Bryant's Kentucky Wildcats during the 1948 campaign?

For two years, the gridiron gods have delivered success to the 34-year-old Kentucky mentor and his squad . . .

But what will happen in Bryant's third season at the Bluegrass school? For that question, the youthful, good-looking Bryant has a stock reply.

"When you lose nine players from your starting eleven and five more from your squad in one season what would you expect to happen?

"With the Southeastern Conference freshman rule now back in force, we are allowed to play only the men who were eligible last July 1. This simply means we will replace nine first string players with boys who were only good enough last fall to be second, third, and fourth stringers.

"That seems to be answer enough!"

Bryant in two seasons at Kentucky has compiled an unequalled record at the Bluegrass school. Arriving here from the University of Maryland early in 1946, Bryant was greeted by a squad which had won just two games the previous season while losing eight.

With snow still many inches deep on Stoll Field, Bryant and his newly formed staff went to work. After several weeks' work, he was still missing what he was looking for — gridiron material.

Drills were concluded. Bryant and his staff started on a recruit-

ing program. In June, a portion of his harvest arrived. Some more enrolled in September.

That 1946 season produced seven victories and only three losses. Kentucky emerged from the S.E.C. doldrums.

Last season, these boys who had compiled such an enviable record in '46 were seniors. They went all out to win eight games while losing three to again amaze the Southern football powers.

Included in this string of victories was a 26-0 triumph over the Georgia Sugar Bowl champs and a 24-14 win over Villanova in the inaugural Great Lakes Bowl game.

Bryant this fall is faced with the task of rebuilding his entire machine from a squad riddled by graduation and academic attrition.

By graduation, Kentucky lost two starting ends, George Sengel and Don Ridge. By academic attrition, Dick Hensley departed. Both starting tackles—Bill Griffin and Wash Serini—swapped pigskins for sheepskins.

Five guards, the heart of the forward wall, will be missing — Hut Jones, Matt Lair, Gene Haas, Leo Yarutis, and Charles Browning.

Jay Rhodemyre, Kentucky's allconference center, completed his eligibility. There remains a big hole to be filled.

Kentucky's two best all-around backs—Fullback Bill Moseley and Halfback Jack Farris—were graduated. Farris was the team's leading ground gainer with a 6.4 yards per try average. Moseley had a 3.5 average. They were both excellent defensive men, especially on an aerial attack.

Let's look at the prospects for the coming season. At the flanks, there's Ben Zaranka, (6-4 191), Jerry Claiborne (5-10 175), Charles Bentley (6 190), Don Frampton (6-2 195), and Wallace Jones (6-4 195). Jones, however went to the Olympics with the basketball team. He may not make the quick physical transition from the round ball to football.

Four tackles – Bob Gain (6-3 215), Doc Ferrell (6 198), Lloyd McDermott (6-1 215), and Frank Smotherman (6-4 215) – will be available for service. Ferrell and McDermott seem to have the inside track for starting jobs.

The guard situation is definitely not good. This is one of the obvious weak spots in the Kentucky line. Of the eight men listed as guards, only four appear to be in the running this fall.

Dick Holway (5-10 183), Pat James (6-1 195), Bill Dawson (5-10 190) and Ray Porter (5-10 185) are the quartet given the nod by Bryant as most likely to succeed.

With one exception, the center spot is woefully weak. Harry Ulinski (6-2 196) is back for his junior season. The rangy flipperback was troubled with a knee injury last fall. This spring he underwent an operation. If it proves successful, then Ulinski can almost count on being a sixty minute man in the line-up.

The backfield, generally speaking, is a brighter thought than the line.

To assist Quarterback George Blanda, will be Carl Genito, a sophomore. Carl played as a freshman halfback for Bryant during the 1946 campaign and last season he was withheld. Genito doesn't possess a tremendous amount of ability, but he seems to do everything well when under pressure. Besides being a better passer than Blanda, Genito is a threat as a runner.

The halfbacks are adequate. At the right side, there's Jim Howe (6-1 175), and Dick Martin (6 170). Howe is a junior and a youngster who is not blessed with a great deal of speed. But he's one of those runners who someway, somehow, always manages to shake off the tacklers and go for long gains. Martin is only a sophomore, but he has fine possibilities, and he's sure to see action. Defensively, he's probably the roughest halfback on the squad.

At the left side, there are two small, but powerful men. Bill Boller (5-11 180) and Shorty Jamerson (5-8 170). Both played a lot last fall.

Boller can pass, kick, and run while Jamerson, a slow youngster afoot, relies on a good change of place to ward off tacklers.

Fullbacks are numerous, but only two boys—Dopey Phelps and Lee Truman—are seriously considered. Phelps has a terrific reputation as a runner. His freshman season, he was tops in the nation at running back punts and kickoffs. Last fall, his sophomore year, he was going great until the West Virginia game where he suffered a shoulder injury.

The Wildcat Offense

SYSTEM-Kentucky will use the T-formation exclusively this fall.

RUNNING GAME—With such fine runners as Don (Dopey) Phelps, Bill Boller, Wilbur (Shorty) Jamerson, Jim Howe, Dick Martin and Lee Truman to rely upon, the Wildcats should have an effective ground attack. Their greatest disadvantage will be lack of weight, with Truman, who tips the scales at 188 pounds, being the heaviest of the lot.

PASSING GAME—Kentucky's aerial attack should be much the same as last season, with Senior George Blanda doing the bulk of the pitching. In relief roles will be Carl Genito, who showed considerable promise in spring practice; Boller, Phelps, Paul Jones and Ogden Thomas. On the receiving end will be the veteran Wallace (Wah Wah) Jones, Sophomore Ben Zaranka, Charlie Bentley and Jerry Claiborne Passing undoubtedly will play a major part in the Wildcats' offense this fall.

PUNTING GAME—Heading the list of kickers for the Kentuckians will be Blanda, one of the outstanding booters in the country. He will be ably assisted by Phelps, Clayton Webb and Martin.

EXTRA POINTS AND KICK-OFFS—Here again it will be Blanda who will get first call, followed by Tackle Bob Gain, Boller, Bobby Brooks and Jerry Claiborne. Gain, a sophomore, and Boller, a junior, showed considerable promise in this department last season.

SAFETY MEN—This is one of Coach Bryant's lesser worries, with such performers as Phelps, one of the speediest backs in the South; Jamerson, Thomas and Carl Genito to rely upon. Phelps and Jamerson are expected to see the most service.

SIGNAL CALLERS—Master-minding the Wildcat team on the field will be one of three quarterbacks, Blanda, Carl Genito or Paul Jones. Because of his experience, Blanda will bear most of the burden here although Genito and Jones are expected to come in for their share of play-calling.



The Bryant Story . . .

It began back in February 1946 when Paul Bryant affixed his signature to a Kentucky contract . . . The Wildcats that season won seven while losing three for their most successful season in the Modern Age. . . . Last fall, Kentucky won eight and lost three to surpass the '46 mark.

In November 1946, Bryant's original five-year contract was extended to cover a 10-year period . . . A native of Fordyce, Arkansas, Bryant starred in football and basketball while attending high school there.

From Fordyce, Bryant went to college . . . the University of Alabama . . . From 1933 to 1935, the Arkansas traveler starred for Coach Frank Thomas' red-shirts . . . In 1935, Bryant was the right end on that famous Alabama Rose Bowl eleven . . . His roommate was Don Hutson, later of Green Bay Packer fame, the Tide's left end.

That '34 Alabama eleven was acclaimed by old Capstone followers as the most powerful and colorful in Alabama gridiron history.

Following his graduation from Alabama, Bryant remained as

Thomas' assistant for four seasons. It was during this period that he absorbed the Alabama system—Coach Tommy's system for football success.

From Alabama, Bryant went on to another Southeastern Conference school, Vanderbilt University, where he was line coach. After working with the Commodores two seasons, the year 1942 rolled around.

The United States was at war. Bryant entered the Navy. His first station was the Pre-Flight School at Athens, Georgia. Then overseas . . . to Africa.

On his return, Bryant was assigned to the North Carolina Pre-Flight School. Shortly thereafter, the war ended. Lieutenant Commander Paul Bryant was released to inactive duty.

The University of Maryland offered Bryant a three-year contract. He accepted their offer a few days before the season opened. Six wins, two losses and a tie resulted—Maryland's best gridiron record in its history. His eleven impressively defeated the University of Virginia Cavaliers, a team which had won 16 straight contests.

The Coaching Staff

CARNEY LASLIE . . . Like Paul Bryant is a University of Alabama product and a former Rose Bowl star for the Crimson Tide . . . Laslie lettered three years at 'Bama '30, '31 and '32 . . . In '32 he played on the Tide eleven which won a 24-0 decision over Washington State in the Pasadena classic . . . Remained at Alabama as an assistant for one year after graduating . . . Then he became head football coach at the Blytheville, Arkansas, high school . . . His teams went undefeated for three seasons and then Laslie went to V.M.I. as line coach . . . From the Lexington, Va., school, Laslie entered the Navy . . . While in the Navy, he coached the North Carolina Pre-Flight eleven . . . Released to inactive duty after three years service with the rank of Lieutenant Commander . . . Joined Bryant at Maryland a few days before the 1945 season opened . . . Specializes in coaching tackles at Kentucky . . . Married and has an eleven-year-old daughter.

FRANK MOSELEY . . . A native of Montgomery, Alabama . . . Quarterbacked the Tide elevens in '31, '32 and '33 . . . Played two seasons on the same Alabama teams as Laslie . . . Came to Kentucky in 1934

and served as backfield coach under Chet Wynne and Ab Kirwan . . . Entered the Navy in '42 . . . Served as gunnery officer aboard the aircraft carrier Lexington with the rank of Lieutenant Commander . . . A veteran of practically every battle in the Pacific . . . Joined Bryant a few days before the season opened at Maryland . . . Backfield coach at Kentucky . . . Married and has a fifteen-months-old son . . . Called "Mose" by many, but "Bully" or "Chesty" by his old Capstone acquaintances.

ERMAL ALLEN . . . Joined the Kentucky coaching staff after being ruled ineligible after two games in the 1946 season in one of the Southeastern Conference's most controversial cases . . . Last fall, Allen played professional football with the All-American League champions, Paul Brown's Cleveland Browns . . . Ermal was a T-quarterback for the Brownies . . . He will be a valuable addition to the Kentucky staff this fall because of his knowledge of the T . . . Married and is the father of two children.

CLARENCE UNDERWOOD . . . A 1938 Marshall College graduate where he was a varsity guard for three years . . . Joined Kentucky's staff early this year . . . Coached at Beckley, West Virginia, high school from 1938-43 . . . Served three years in the Navy as a Lieutenant . . . Married and the father of two children.

TED D. OSBORN . . . Is the latest addition to the Kentucky staff, arriving in July from Akron Central High School, Akron, Ohio, where he had been head basketball and football coach for 12 years . . . Osborn was graduated from Ohio Wesleyan in 1931 where he starred as a halfback for three seasons . . . Following his graduation, Osborn went to Ohio State in 1933 as a freshman coach . . . Served during the war as a Lieutenant in the Navy.

JOE ATKINSON . . . Was a star guard with Vanderbilt from '39 to '41 . . . Bryant coached Atkinson in '40 and '41 when he was line coach at Vandy . . . Joe captained the '41 Commodore eleven . . . Entered the Navy after graduation in '42 . . . Served 46 months . . . Skippered a PT . . . Came to Kentucky immediately after his discharge in March, 1946 . . . Handles the guards . . . A native of Lebanon, Tennessee . . . Married.

LEFT ENDS

BEN ZARANKA . . .6-4 187 20 . . . East Chicago, Indiana . . . Sophomore . . . Earned a reputation last year, his freshman season, as a great pass receiver . . . He should be a starter this fall . . . Attended Roosevelt High School in East Chicago where he was an All-State end . . . Was a pitcher for the Wildcat baseball team last spring . . . Plans a career as a profootballer following his graduation.

JERRY CLAIBORNE . . . 5-10 . . 165 . . . 20 . . . Hopkinsville, Kentucky . . . Junior . . . He's not too big, but what there is of him is all football player . . . Jerry is what Coach Bryant calls a "100 per cent boy," meaning that he puts out all of the time whether its Saturday or Tuesday . . . Has been switched from a blocking back to end . . . He's destined to see action this fall . . . Majoring in mathematics.

NICK ODLIVAK . . . 6 . . . 190. ... 23 .. Aliquippa, Pennslyvania . . . Junior . . . Has played every position on the Kentucky team as a reserve . . . Coach Bryant last spring switched Nick from a back to the end position. . J. He's good enough, however, to play almost anywhere on the club . . . Majoring in Education. . . When he was a freshman, Nick hitch-hiked to the Georgia game at Athens . . . Coach Bryant met him on the street . . . Bryant suggested that he "dress-out" for the game . . . Nick did and played more than a half of the contest as Kentucky's quarterback.

LEFT TACKLES

BOB GAIN . . . 6-3 . . . 220 . . . 19 . . . Weirton, West Virginia . . . Sophomore . . . One of the greatest line prospects ever to enroll at Kentucky . . . Was selected on the Southeastern Conference's All-Freshman squad last fall . . . While at Weirton High School, he was an All-State selection . . . Watch this big boy . . . He'll have a lot to do with the success or failure of Kentucky's line this fall. . . . He possesses all of the physical qualities to be a great football player . . . He has speed to burn for a big man . . . And he's still growing.

DOC FERRELL . . . 6 . . . 198 . . . 21 . . . Richmond, Kentucky . . . Senior . . . One of four seniors on the squad . . . If he has a good season, it will be a great aid to Kentucky line which was hit hard by graduation in June . . . Doc has had a sufficient amount of experience to be a valuable man to the Wildcats this fall . . . Major in Physical Education . . . Was an All-State player at Richmond High School.

LEFT GUARDS

DICK HOLWAY . . . 5-10 . . . 183 . . . 23 . . . Youngstown, Ohio . . . Junior . . . Plays strictly because he wants to . . . What Dick lacks in ability, he makes up in competitive spirit . . . Was used as a reserve last year, but he's certain to see plenty of service this fall . . . Played only one year of high school football.

PAT JAMES . . . 6-1 . . . 180 . . . 20 . . . New Boston, Ohio . . .

Sophomore . . . Has been used only as a reserve so far, but he's a cinch to play a lot this fall . . . A tough and rugged boy.

ALLEN HAMILTON . . . 5-9 . . . 190 . . . 23 . . . Louisville, Kentucky . . . Sophomore . . . Another one of Kentucky's vest-pocket guards . . . Little, but rugged and tough . . . Played only as a reserve in his freshman season . . . Quick on the offense.

LEONARD PRESTON . . . 6 . . . 205 . . . 25 . . . Louisville, Kentucky . . . Senior . . . One of four seniors on the squad . . . A G.I. Has seen a lot of service in his time with the Wildcats . . . Could be a starter this fall if he's not bothered with injuries . . . A big, powerful man, Len is prematurely grey . . . Married and has a son.

CENTERS

HARRY ULINSKI . . . 6-2 . . . 196 . . . 23 . . . Ambridge, Pennsylvania . . . Junior . . . Will be Kentucky's replacement for its All-Conference man, Jay Rhodemyre . . . Harry was injured last year . . . This winter his knee was operated on . . . And his physical condition is still very much a question mark . . . If he is able to play, he should be a starter . . . And a very good one . . . He comes from a football family . . . Ed Ulinski is with Paul Brown's Cleveland Browns in the All-American League . . . And Ray is the quarterback for Penn State . . . Potential he's a great football player . . . Without him, Kentucky will be weak in the middle of the line.

WALT YOWARSKY . . . 6-1 . . . 205 . . . 20 . . . Cleveland, Ohio Sophomore . . . "Smitty," as Yo-

warsky is called by his teammates, will be used as a utility man this fall . . . He's big and strong and could be a valuable substitute.

RIGHT GUARDS

BILL DAWSON . . . 5-10 . . . 190 23 . . . Louisville, Kentucky . . . Sophomore . . . The Round Man should be a contender for a starting berth this fall . . . A short squat individual, Dawson is extremely hard to move on the defense . . . Offensively, he's a fine blocker . . . This is a weak spot in the Kentucky line . . . Dawson's play could be a tremendous contribution to Kentucky's success this fall.

RAY PORTER . . . 5-10 . . . 185 22 . . . Cincinnati, Ohio . . . Junior . . . A converted back, Ray will see plenty of service this fall . . . A good, steady all-around player, he will be a valuable member of the squad . . . A good blocker, especially on down field work . . . If he can come through with a good season, it will be a pleasant surprise for the Wildcat coaching staff.

RIGHT TACKLES

LLOYD McDERMOTT . . . 6-1 . . . 215 . . . 22 . . . Covington, Kentucky . . . Junior . . . Is a big man who will play an important part in the Wildcat line this fall . . . As a sophomore, Mac saw a lot of action . . . This fall, he should be a contender for a starting berth . . . He has the native ability and he has indicated his desire to play football . . . Was an All-State man while playing with Holmes High School in Covington . . . For a big man he gets around very well.

FRANK SMOTHERMAN . . . 6-1 . . . 215 . . . 24 . . . Murfreesboro, Tennessee . . . Junior . . . Is another player with tremendous promise . . . He has all of the physical attributes necessary for a good player . . . Lacks experience . . . The coaching staff will be watching this boy closely . . . If he comes through it will aid Kentucky's chances immensely.

RIGHT END

WALLACE (WAH-WAH) JONES ... 6-4 ... 195 ... 21 ... Harlan, Kentucky . . . Senior . . . Is regarded as one of the finest all-around athletes ever to enroll at Kentucky . . . Has lettered three straight seasons in basketball, football, and baseball . . . Is a great pass receiver and a great team man . . . Was injured during most of the season last year . . . Just returned in time from the Olympics with the United States basketball team to report for practice . . . The University of Kentucky

Located in Lexington, an urban community of 90,000 population, it is a state supported institution which operates under the direction of the Board of Trustees. Membership of this Board includes the Governor, the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and the Commissioner of Agriculture, ex officio, and twelve members appointed by the Governor, three of whom are alumni of the University and three members of the State Board of Agriculture. It is one of a number of institutions known as land-grant colleges, which were established by the Morrill Act of 1862, and which will continue to receive federal assistance under the provisions.

The University is on the approved list of the Association of American Universities, and is a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Kentucky Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. It is accredited in its respective colleges or departments by the Association of American Law Schools, the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business, the American Association of Schools and Departments of Journalism, the American Library Association, the National Association of Schools of Music, and

the Engineers' Council for Professional Development.

The major function of the University is that of instruction. For the performance of this function it is organized into the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Agriculture and Home Economics, the College of Engineering, the College of Law, the College of Education, the College of Commerce, the Graduate School, a Department of University Extension and a College of Pharmacy, located at Louisville. Residence instruction is given through 2 semesters and summer school.

In addition to giving instruction to its student body, the University contributes to the welfare of the state through research, experimentation, and public service. While all departments make important contributions along these lines, certain divisions and bureaus have been

established specifically for these purposes.

The University began as a part of Kentucky University under a cooperative plan authorized by the legislature in 1865. The purpose of this plan was to unite sectarian and public education under one organization. This experiment was tried for a number of years. In the meantime, the Federal funds authorized under the Morrill Act were used to develop agriculture and mechanical arts in Kentucky University. In 1878, when the people of Kentucky decided to establish a state institution of higher learning, the College of Agriculture and Mechanical Arts was separated from Kentucky University and reestablished on land given by the City of Lexington and the County of Fayette. Thirty years later the legislature changed the name of the institution to the State University of Kentucky, and gave it additional financial support. In 1916 the name was again changed, this time to the present title, and additional maintenance was arranged by legislative act.

The President is Dr. Herman L. Donovan, one of the most sportsminded university executives in the United States. Under Dr. Donovan's direction, the University has launched on a building program a feature of which will be the construction of a \$3,000,000 field house.



Footnote A — Although numerical scoring had not yet been introduced in Rugby football, either here or in Great Britian, when Kentucky and Transylvania (then known as Kentucky University) played their series in 1881, persons in charge of the games obviously had arrived at some sort of agreement assigning numerical values to the various scoring plays. Records never existed and men who played in the games are scattered or dead. All we can do is accept the scores printed in the newspapers — and surmise that a touchdown perhaps counted ¼ point and that a goal or an end-kick (a punt into the modern end zone) counted 1. That seems logical, since in the ratio scoring of that day, a touchdown was worth one-quarter of a goal. The end-kick, a British heritage, undubtedly was introduced because all realized that green players would score few goals, if any.

Footnote B—The football rules took no official position on the score of a forfeited game until 1908 when it was pegged at 1-0 to make it different from any other score possible in the game. By common consent, forfeited games prior to that were entered into the records as victories by 6-0 for the offended team—everywhere, that is, except in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association, predecessor of the Southern Conference and the Southeastern Conference. In the S. I. A. A. the 6-0 practice was followed unless the offended team had a greater number of points. In that case, the offended team won by the greater score to nothing. Thus, Kentucky's forfeiture to Central University in 1900 is 6-0, since Kentucky led by 11-0 at the time. Kentucky led Cumberland by 12-11 in 1905 when the Tennesseans forfeited. The Blue and White, under S. I. A. A. rules, gets credit for a 12-0 victory.
