Motion was made and approved by the Senate to suspend the rule which states that a student who has been dropped a second time shall not be readmitted to the University in order to consider the following recommendations:

readmission to the College of Agriculture of Thomas Dudley Arkle, Jr., presented by Dean Wall and approved by the Senate;

readmission to the College of Commerce of Robert K. Flynn; Neil William Hennessey; Claude William Howard; Edward J. McAvoy; Sammy Warren Peach; William Anthony Todd; Paul K. Cowhig, Jr.; and Jerrel L. Greer, presented by Dean Haywood and approved by the Senate;

readmission to the College of Engineering of Walter Thomas Watts and Edward Harold Jones, presented by Dean Shaver and approved by the Senate;

readmission to the School of Architecture of Ernest Ray Polley who had been dropped by the College of Engineering, presented by Mr. Wilkins, recommended by Dean Shaver, and approved by the Senate.

Dr. Cochran gave a brief progress report on the academic plan for the Senate Council. He reported that the committee reports resulting from the implementation of the Academic Analysis, together with college reports and other documents, were in the process of being reproduced and bound for circulation to the entire teaching faculty and should be in the mail shortly; that these reports were being issued as an appendix to a second volume of the Academic Analysis which would, in turn, be circulated before the October Senate meeting; that this second volume would contain a summary of recommendations probably divided into three parts, namely, action recommendations to the President or other administrative officers, and the Board, recommendations requiring Senate action, and recommendations to the faculties of the various colleges. He asked that the recommendations requiring Senate action be studied as they will be brought to the October meeting of the Senate.

A motion in the form of a resolution was presented to withdraw accreditation to the Students for a Democratic Society, a campus organization recently granted accreditation by the Committee on Student Organizations and Social Activities. The Senate defeated the motion.

Dean Ginger presented a recommendation that both grade and credit earned by William Robert Skeans at the University of Kentucky in English 102 be considered as duplicating course work already completed at Caney Junior College and that neither grade or credit be considered in Mr. Skeans' requirements for graduation. The Senate approved the recommendation as presented thus permitting Mr. Skeans to have completed his degree require-

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE, OCTOBER 11, 1965

The University Senate met in regular session at 4:00 p.m., Monday, October 11, 1965 in the Student Center Theatre. Chairman Pellegrino presided.

The minutes of September 13, 1965 were approved.

The Senate approved correction in the minutes of May 7, 1965 to include MED 335, a Physical Therapy course which it had approved but which had been omitted from the circulated minutes.

The Chairman of the Rules Committee presented recommended changes in the University Senate Rules which had been circulated to the faculty under date of October 4, 1965. The Senate considered each recommendation and with a deletion and some additions approved these changes as follows:

1. Page 12 - 14th line. Strike out the words "for graduate students".
2. Page 14 - Paragraph beginning with the 13th line. Delete this entire paragraph beginning with "If a student is readmitted . . ." and substitute the following:
"If a student is readmitted, he shall be required to achieve a minimum grade point average of 2.0 for the first semester after readmission; a minimum grade point average of 2.5 for the second semester after readmission or a cumulative minimum average of 2.0 by the end of the second semester; and a cumulative minimum average of 2.0 by the end of the third semester. Failure to attain any of these requirements will result in his being dropped from the University".
3. Page 15 - Sentence beginning on 38th line. Delete from this sentence beginning with "A student who has been dropped . . ." the period at the end of the sentence and continue the sentence by adding "except in unusual circumstances and then only upon recommendation of his dean and approval of the University Senate Council".
4. Page 7 - 17th line, section labeled "b.)". Delete all this section b, starting with "All out-of-state applicants . . ." and replace with
