STYROFOAM NOT AT HOME AT U.K.

From the office of Jack C. Blanton:

The University has embarked on a number of efforts aimed at taking a leadership position in rducing the negative impact of non-biodegradable items on our environment. The UK Waste Management Tast Force has recommended phasing out several items in this category. As a result Food Services has eliminated styrofoam products in the cafeterias. Within the next few months the Stores Department will replace all styrofoam products with substitutes that are less harmful to the environment. In addition, yellow writing pads, which are not recyclable will be dropped from our inventory in favor of white writing pads. These actions have the support of President Wethington and members of his Cabinet.

OMS OFFERING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS

INSTITUTE HELD FOR 2ND YEAR

The second annual Resource Management Institute will be held in Scottsdale, Arizona February 11-14. The Institute covers the relationship between organizational planning and resource management, budget preparation, basic accounting concepts, responsibility for expenditure control, reporting functions and formats, and techniques for budget presentation. The program also includes an integrative exercise that gives hands-on with developing, presenting and defending a budget. Previous participants include budget officers, assistant directors for administration, unit heads, department heads and directors.

Susan Jurow, Director of the Office of Management Services of the Association of Research Libraries and

Gerry Munoff, Deputy Director of the University of Chicago Library will conduct the Institute which will be held at the Safari Resort in Scottsdale. Room rates at the rsort will be \$85/night, single or double occupancy. In addition, OMS has made arrangements with United Airlines for participants to receive up to 40% discount on regular roundtrip airfares. United will also give participants an additional 5% discount on published supersaver fares. Tuition for the Institute is \$475 per person for ARL Member Libraries, \$525 for non-ARL Libraries.

EUROPEAN EDUCATIONAL EXCHANGE

Maureen Pastine of the Central University Libraries at SMU will be leading a librarian educational exchange to Berlin, Prague, Budapest and Vienna August 14-27. 1991. The purpose of the exchange is to meet with librarian counterparts to discuss library issues and to tour library facilities -- academic, public and special. Areas of discussion will include Library administration, automation and technology in libraries, library instruction/user education, and the role of library schools, continuing education for librarians and professional association roles. There will also be

plenty of time in each city for sightseeing.

The price of the trip is \$2,890.00 per person, based on double occupancy. This includes airfare from JFK Airport on Lufthansa Airlines, lodging, daily breakfasts, other meals as indicated in the itinerary, scheduled events, tours and transportation within and between the four countries. BIBLIOGRAPHIC POLICY #15 RELEASED

On November 13, 1990, the Bibliographic Policies and Procedures Advisory Group released Policy #15 which is titled "Mixed Media Materials."

The policy lays out options for the records made up for items that contain two or more forms of media (e.g., a book with a computer disk attached). It also lists the varying

ways that these items are housed in the various libraries of the system. Following the policy are examples of records with the linking notes for the types of treatment.
