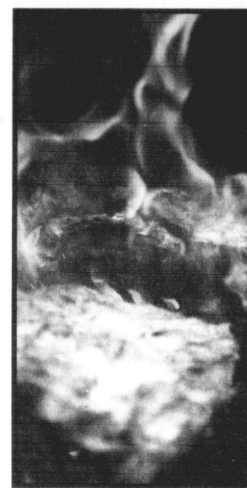

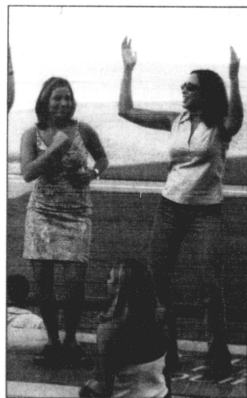

Food, drinks, relaxation: Whatever your preference, you'll find it on South Limestone

Aside from the romantic architecture and the lively strip on South Limestone Street, UK and Lexington have many shady spots and taciturn gardens that can't go unnoticed.

stone. Just across the street from Two Keys Tavern is Kashmir Indian Restaurant and around the corner you'll find Mad Mushroom Pizza and Slice of Chicago — take your pick.

After admiring those bricks and glass, I hopped back onto South Limestone and took note of even more choice eateries and some quaint shops. Among them are Everybody's Restaurant, Pazzo's Pizza, Jimmy John's gourmet sub shop and Jersey Mike's giant submarines and sandwiches. If you take Euclid Avenue at South Limestone you will come to Mr. Wok, proclaiming advertising the finest Chinese and Vietnamese cuisine.

Look no further than the corner of Bolivar and South Upper streets, behind the parking garage for Laser Quest and Lexington Rocks, a new rock climbing facility. Now for the shady spots and taciturn gardens. The foremost garden I can recommend is the UK Arboretum. Here, you'll discover plenty of trees, flowers and shrubbery to take in. There's also plenty of wildlife.

It's located off Alumni Drive, but a similar environment can be found all around campus. On the campus side of the same corner, in front of Alumni Gym and the Student Center, you're bound to find a shady area to sit.

All in all, I found that time enough did not allow me to scope out our campus in its entirety. There are many places yet to see and perhaps a few places still remaining undiscovered. See and be seen: Local restaurants offer students fine dining and drinking in the great outdoors

"Al Fresco" dining, also known as dining outdoors or patio dining, is always a refreshing way to enjoy a meal or a drink with friends. Around campus there are an array of places students can visit to enjoy the fresh air and the pleasures of dining outdoors.

The common and frequently visited like Pazzo's Pizza Pub, Kitty O'Sheas Irish Pub and Two Keys Tavern sit right on the northern side of campus on South Limestone. Although Two Keys is not noted for its dining, its patio is a place where people can get a drink or two and enjoy some music and socializing.

Pazzo's is a popular pizza parlor that has a small patio where people can enjoy pizza and beer with friends. Kitty O'Sheas, an Irish pub with a small patio, allows customers to enjoy the pleasure of a cold drink and some fresh air while watching the hustle and bustle of college students in the area.

The downtown area also has several places common among the college crowd, both students and professionals.

The Rosebud (La Petite Rose) has a New Orleans and French Quarters kind of swing to it. Even though the patio is quaint, it still manages to stay packed inside and out. Atomic

Café and Cheapside Bar & Grill are also places in the downtown area that attract many.

For something different that strays from the norm, there are several choices one has to choose from on the southern side of campus providing the pleasures of patio dining and more. Cosmo's Fine Foods, across from the Chevy Chase Plaza, is a unique deli offering a diverse atmosphere ideal for students and professionals.

Upon entering the place, one could easily mistake it for a grocery store because of all the shelves of dried and canned goods and beverages from all over the world. If you keep walking it becomes very apparent that it is far from just a grocery store. There is a coffee/wine bar with fine wine, coffee and beer from Europe, South America and Australia. The deli in the rear offers a wide assortment of dishes ranging from casseroles to steamed veggies to pasta salads and rice dishes. It also has a fine selection of soups, sandwiches and entrees.

And that's not all. Cosmo's also has a desert case filled with freshly baked cookies, cakes, pastries and shelves of imported sweets for those who want to cure a sweet tooth! The patio of Cosmo's is also very quaint but pleasant. Whether one decides to eat breakfast, lunch or dinner, have a glass of wine or beer, it allows stu-

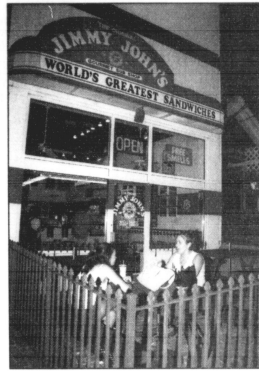
dents to experience "al fresco" dining with flavors from all over the world. Charlie Brown's, also in the Chevy Chase area, is a fun, relaxing spot, which attracts students and professionals alike. Walking into the place is definitely a strain on the eyes. The lounge is quite dim and lit with only the light of small candles that are the center-pieces for each table.

The couches and sedate atmosphere are perfect for an after-work or after-class refreshment. The walls are lined with books for patrons to read.

The food is American: appetizers, burgers, fries, chicken and fish sandwiches. The patio is behind the restaurant, which avoids the noisy traffic and gives the customers the chance to relax outdoors. It also features a free jukebox for the 'ol skool' fans that plays the best of the 60s, 70s and 80s.

Mary's Bar-B-Que Pit Stop on South Broadway is a pleasant eating experience. Although it is mostly carry-out, there is a small patio area where patrons can sit and enjoy the down-home cooking that Mary's provides. Known for its North Carolina chopped pork sandwich and barbecue ribs, Mary's delivers to and around campus and offers students a 15 percent discount with a valid student ID.

These are all places for students who are willing to explore something different and enjoy culture and diversity. The atmospheres provide culture and give patrons a taste of the good ol' outdoors.

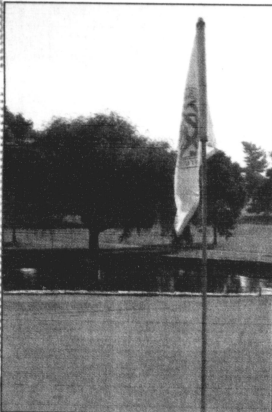

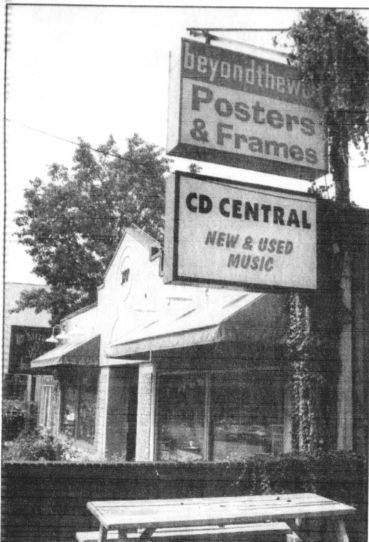

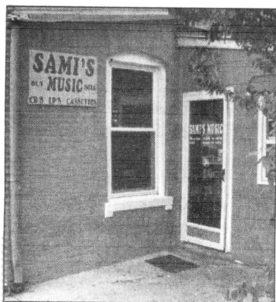

With Napster attempting to comply with court orders and other mp3 servers getting more and more difficult to find, students may wonder where they can get music.

For students open to paying for music, Lexington has a number of stores near UK's campus where students can pick up the latest album by their favorite artist.

● The closest to campus is CD Warehouse, located near Baskin Robbins at the intersection of Euclid Avenue and Rose Street. The store offers both new and used compact discs for lower prices than national music stores.

Students can do more than just buy music at CD Warehouse. Those who are looking to get rid of the embarrassing albums in their collection, if they are of good quality, can sell them for cash. CD Warehouse is open from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Saturday and 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday.

● Another store close to campus is CD Central, located on South Limestone Street. Jason Ward, an agricultural engineering senior, said CD Central is a good place to find hard-to-find albums.

"I like the music played on WRVG-FM (a Georgetown radio station)," he said. "I can find acoustic CDs and other music played on the station at CD Central."

CD Central is open 11 a.m. until 9 p.m., Monday through Saturday and 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday.

● Venturing off campus to find musical bargains can be well worth the gas money. Best Buy, a national electronic chain, is known for selling music at low prices. Clark Shuman, a campus ministry intern, regularly shops at Best Buy located on Nicholasville Road in the South Park Plaza.

"I feel that Best Buy has the widest selection and the best prices," Shuman said.

Best Buy is open from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Saturday and 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday.

● Across the street from Best Buy is Disc Jockey Superstore, which is open until 10 p.m. on weekdays and Saturday, and from 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday. The prices are a little more expensive, but the store has a wide variety of music, videos, T-shirts and posters.

Farther down Nicholasville Road is Fayette Mall, which has two music stores to choose from. Sam Goody, which was renovated and moved to a new location adjacent to the food court almost a year ago, is a nationwide chain offering music, videos, DVDs, sheet music and specialty items. Students can expect to pay full price for music unless it is on sale, but Sam Goody offers a wide selection.

Although Cameiot Music is smaller, it offers the same variety of music and movies at around the same price as Sam Goody.

The mall is open from 10 a.m. until 9 p.m., Monday through Saturday and 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday.

Students who are searching for bargains at Wal-Mart, be wary. While the chain offers lower prices on music, some compact discs are censored for offensive language.

No matter what type of music students prefer, Lexington offers a variety of stores that are certain to have a good selection.

Buy me some peanuts: After a summer of success, the Legends continue entertaining Lexingtonians until October

Having a winning season and breaking inaugural-season league records, South Atlantic League's single-A Lexington Legends baseball club has swung into the city with style, winning over fans since opening day in April, and being one of the hottest spots in the metro area.

If you're looking to end the long days of summer without spending a whole lot of cash, come to Lexington's version of "Field of Dreams" at Applebee's Park and watch America's favorite pastime.

A fan attraction, the Legends set a league record by drawing 100,000 fans faster than any team in league history on May 9, only one month after opening day. Then, one month later on June 8 the team reached the 200,000 fan mark.

Maybe a reason for drawing record attendance is the

affordable ticket prices.

Get a group of friends together and see a game for under \$10 after going nine innings in classes all day. Single game ticket prices range from \$7 for box seats to \$5 for reserved seats along the first and third baselines. There's also general admission seating for \$4 or you can sit in the "Bleacher Bum" section behind the left outfield wall.

Catching a Legends game is also a great substitute to going to a club or out to dinner for a night.

Other than the traditional hot dog and beer to satisfy your cravings for the munchies at the ballpark, there's a smorgasbord of food choices. Choices include a sub stand, ice cream, funnel cakes, and one of those big breadsticks from local pizzeria Joe Bologna's.

If you haven't driven by the ballpark, the \$13.5 million state-of-the-art facility is something to see.

To see if the umpire's call was fair, you can catch the replay on the 25-by-25 foot Jumbotron video scoreboard screen in the ballpark. A video scoreboard is visible from every location and broadcasts information, including inning by inning scores and stats, throughout each game.

If you want to be a kid at heart, along the left outfield wall, there's a carousel and a speed pitch where fans can test how fast they can throw a fast-ball or knuckleball.

The Legends promotions department keeps the fans' attention during the middle of each inning with fun, sometimes wacky entertainment such as, "spinning around on a bat" for free round-trip airline tickets or a free dinner for "going head first" into a bucket of barbecue sauce.

If you're looking for something to fulfill your boredom until October, get your baseball glove, head out to the ballpark, try to catch a foul ball.

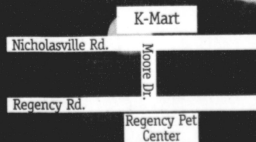

"It was a major concern in the past to have a place for the men's and women's golf teams to play," said Larry Ivy, UK athletics director, who hopes the university can host its own tournaments and the Southeastern Conference Tournament in the future.

"Now they finally have a place to call home," Ivy said.

The University Club is a "members only" course, but UK students and faculty can join at reduced fees.

Despite a home golf course, most

students and 25 handicappers are likely to play at Lakeside, Meadowbrook or Tates Creek golf courses, the three courses closest to campus.

Many of the public courses offer student or UK staff discounts.

"We have special rates for UK employees and students that are discounted five dollars from \$20 for 18 holes with a cart," said Tom Simpkins, the assistant pro at Connemara Golf Links.

Connemara is located approximately 3.5 miles south of Man o' War Boulevard on Nicholasville Road.

Brad Taylor, a history senior, said he plays at Connemara and Tates Creek three or four times a month.

"Connemara is a links course," he said. "It has hardly any trees and is very wide open. Tates Creek is really nice."

Taylor said a cost-effective advantage at Tates Creek, located near Tates Creek High School, is

the reduced twilight rate. The rate is reduced in the evenings and golfers are permitted to play as many holes as they can until dark.

Al Chrouser, Lakeside Golf Course's head pro, said the public courses in Lexington are a perfect setup for a city the size of Lexington.

"You get all varieties of courses," Chrouser said. "Being built in different decades with different construction techniques gives each course its own character."

It also gives local golfers a chance to experience golf from different eras and the way the game was played in the past. Golf designs in the late 50s when Lakeside was built were much less radical than at newer courses like Kearney Hill Links.

"It picks up the flavor of the time."

UK's first home golf course is located on Leestown Road. It provides memberships to students and faculty at reduced yearly fees.

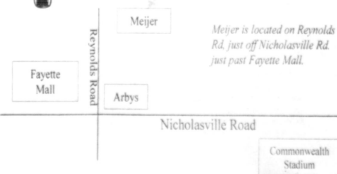

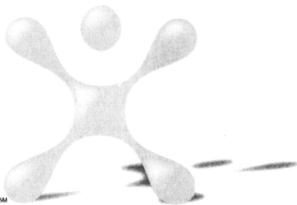

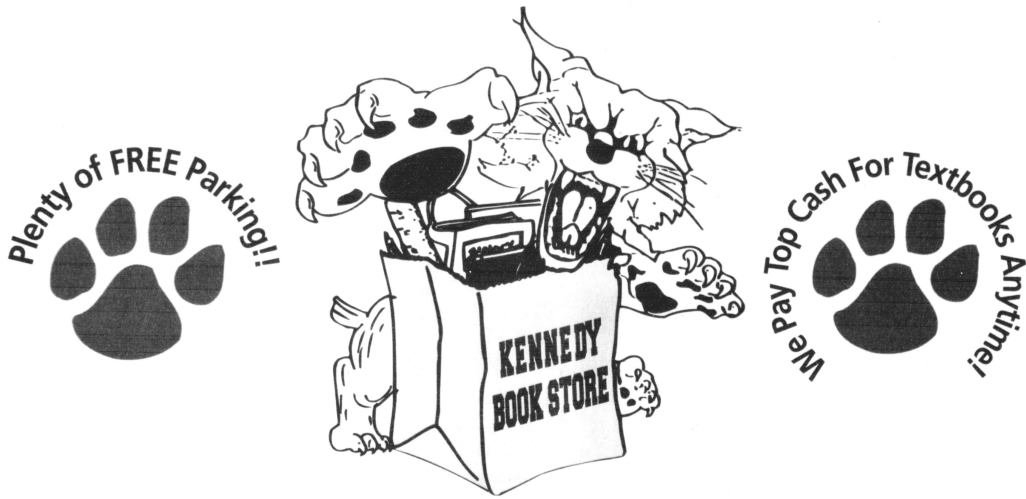
