His request was granted. Downard was directed to pay his mess dues at once. A letter to Prof. Shackelford from W. H. Vinson, complaining of the action of this faculty in dismissing his son John D. Vinson (Act. 1st) and asking a reconsideration of the case was read before the faculty. After some discussion of the case the following resolution was passed unanimously viz: Resolved that the Faculty in accordance with his father's request give John D. Vinson another opportunity of vindicating himself, and hereby notify him that his son is requested to present himself in person accordingly.

The Faculty then adjourned.
