## CONFEDERATE TREASURY NOTES 1861.

No. 1. \$1000, Montgomery; Head J. C. Calhoun in lower left corner; Andrew Jackson lower right corner; National Bank Note Co. \* \* \*

No. 2. \$500, Montgomery; Train of cars on a bridge; Cattle wading in a creek; Female leaning on a barrel; Wheat, plow, &c.; National Bank Note Co. \* \* \*

No. 3. \$100, Montgomery; Train of cars running to the right; National Bank Note Co. \*.

No. 4. \$100, Richmond; Train of cars running to the left; Southern Bank Note Co. \*.

No. 5. \$50, Montgomery; Negroes hoeing in cotton field; National Bank Note Co. \*.

No. 6. \$50, Richmond; Two females seated on cotton bale; Head of Washington, right; Justice left; Southern Bank Note Co. \*.

### JULY 25TH, 1861.

No. 10. \$20; Female riding a deer in center; Indian smoking pipe lower left corner, \*.

No. 11. \$10; Female leaning on a shield; Confederate Flag, Eagle; Female with outstretched arms in lower left corner, \*.

No. 12. \$5; Center piece similar to the preceding \$10 note; Sailor in lower left corner, \*.

No. 13. \$5; "FIVE" across left end; Numeral V in upper left corner; Figure 5 in upper right corner; on back, "Confederate States of America" in blue; J. Manrouvier, New Orleans, \*.

### SEPTEMBER 2ND, 1861.

No. 18. \$50; Train of cars in center; Female figure in right and left lower corners &c., Southern Bank Note Co. \*.

No. 23. \$20; Head of Alexander H. Stephens in center; "Twenty" and "XX" in green, \*.

No. 24. \$20; Three females in center; Figure of Liberty to left; "20" and Scroll in green, \* \*.

No. 29. \$20; Kneeling female figure; Globe and ship in center; Seated female figure in lower left corner; 20s and band of 20s across the face in red; Southern Bank Note Co. \*.

No. 34. \$10; Group of Indians in center; Seated female with trident in upper left corner; Female standing holding X in upper right corner; Xs and Ten with band of Tens, across face in red; Southern Bank Note Co. \*.

No. 41. \$10; Seated female figure leaning on a shield; Eagle, behind, in upper left corner; Train of cars in right center, \*.

No. 44. \$5; Vignette of boy in lower left corner; Machinist with hammer, seated in lower right corner; 5 and Five in red, \* \*.

No. 54. \$2; Head of Benjamin, in left upper corner; The South personified striking down the North and crippling the Eagle, in center, \*.

\* Very scarce; \* \* Rare; \* \* \* Very rare.

Notes marked very scarce if in fine condition, are generally worth from 50 cents to \$2 each, rare \$1 to \$3 each, very rare \$5 to \$10 each, and some varieties much more.

There are many other scarce notes worth from 10 cents to 25 cents each, if in fine condition, such as \$20, \$50 and \$100 notes of July 25th, 1861; also, \$50 and \$100 notes of September 2nd, 1861; also, \$50 and \$100 notes of December 2nd, 1862; also, \$50 and \$100 notes of April 6th, 1863, and the \$500 notes of 1864, all other notes average about 5 cents each, if clean as new excepting the small notes of 1864, which average about \$1 per hundred.

Persons having Confederate Notes or Bonds for sale send them on approval, and I will write just what they are worth to me; if the amount is accepted I will send Money Order, Check or Registered letter on sight, otherwise return the goods on sight.

I buy Confederate "State", also old broken bank bills if in fine condition, but prefer to see them or sample. State number you have of each denomination.
