

Notes on the Financial
Condition of the County.

\$66,000 in Court House
Bonds + \$8,000 due different
persons, making \$74,000 Court
House debt out standing,
on which we pay 8 percent
making \$5,920 annual
interest. In addition to this the
County owes about 100,000\$, and
about 75,000\$ N.H. bonds which
is more than self-supporting.

The Census of 1860 shows
236,167 negroes; that of
1869 - shows 140,445.

The aggregate negro vote
38,500 - Our County about
1000 negro voters.

The expenses of the County
for the year have been
about 60,000\$, but will
probably fall off some
30,000\$ in the future unless
more extensive bridges are
proposed.
