

Toronto, Canada West, Feb. 7th 1865

Account of Monies received from the Confederate Government for the release of Prisoners of War in the South West, & for the purpose of aiding the friends of the South West in effecting a revolution.

Receipts of the Government at Richmond, March 19th 1864,
five thousand dollars in Confederate five dollar notes = \$5000.
Receipts of Government at Richmond, March 20th 1864, one
thousand dollars in Gold = \$1000.

Receipts of Col Jacob Thompson - Toronto, about 1st June
1864, two thousand four hundred & ninety dollars in gold = \$2490.

Receipts of Col J. Thompson - Toronto. About the 24th Aug 1864,
two thousand five hundred in Green Back = \$2500.

Receipts of Col J. Thompson - Chicago Ill (through James A. Barnett),
about the last of Aug. 1864, seven thousand four hundred
dollars in Green Back = \$7400

Receipt of Col J. Thompson (through James A. Barnett) Chicago
Ill about the last of Aug. 1864, five hundred dollars
in gold, making one thousand & fifty dollars in G.B. \$1050

Receipts of Col J. Thompson (through F. Vaughan) Chicago Ill,
about the 28th Aug. 1864, Ten Thousand dollars in
Green Backs = \$10000

Received of C. C. Clay at St. Catharines C.W., about the
21st October 1864, from thousand one hundred dollars
in gold - sold at 2-10 giving eight thousand six hundred
& ten dollars in U. S. Currency = \$18610

Received of C. C. Clay (through Charly Leslie) at Chicago Ill,
about the 30th October 1864, Thirty Thousand dollars in
United States Currency = _____ \$130,000

Paid to Mrs Lindley (of Chicago)
by request of Mrs Morris, for satisfaction
of expenses & trouble in caring for my men - four hundred
dollars U. S. C. \$400
