Aptitude Test for Premedics - No student is to be allowed to take, with the sanction of the University of Kentucky, the aptitude test of the Committee on Aptitude Tests of the Association of American Medical Colleges unless he has a standing of 1.4 or better.

The following resolutions were presented and approved:

"RESOLUTION OF APPRECIATION OF PRESIDENT COOPER

WHEREAS, The retirement of Thomas P. Cooper from the Presidency of the University is rapidly approaching; and

WHEREAS, He has provided the University with able and inspiring leadership in the interim between the memorable administration of President Frank L. McVey and the inauguration of the term of President H. L. Donovan; and

WHEREAS, His friendly personality, his democratic methods, and his discriminating and incisive understanding of University problems have enlisted the enthusiastic and affectionate cooperation of his colleagues; and

WHEREAS, President Cooper, like Dr. McVey in previous years, has maintained a sense of unity throughout the staff of the Institution; therefore be it

Resolved, That the University of Kentucky Senate hereby express its gratification that Dr. Cooper has given the University his able leadership during the period of institutional readjustment between administrations the difficulties of which have been enhanced by war in Europe and Asia; and be it further

Resolved, That the Senate note its particular pleasure in the atmosphere of cordial cooperation cultivated by President Cooper between the Senate and the administration--indeed throughout the University community; and be it further

Resolved, That the Secretary is hereby directed to forward to each member of the Board of Trustees a copy of this resolution."

"RESOLUTION WELCOMING PRESIDENT H. L. DONOVAN

Resolved, That the Senate extend its congratulations to President Donovan of Eastern State Teachers' College on his election to the Presidency of the University of Kentucky and offer its best wishes and cordial cooperation toward a successful administration. The members of the Senate extend a warm welcome to the incoming President at this strategic time in the development of the University of Kentucky and of its service to the Commonwealth. The faculty of the Institution offers full collaboration toward providing larger and more significant service to the people of Kentucky. The Senate as a body, and as individuals, expresses the hope that

the new President may find happiness in the opportunity for constructive leadership of the University.

Resolved, Further, that the secretary is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to President Donovan and to each member of the Board of Trustees."

"RESOLUTION RESPECTING THE ACTION OF THE BOARD, APRIL 1

WHEREAS, The attention of the Senate has been directed to the resolution appearing on pages 12 to 14 of the April 1, 1941, Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, The Senate of the University, appreciating fully the valuable and constructive work which has always been performed by the Board of Trustees in the development of the institution, desires to make available its technical acquaintance with educational procedures should the Board of Trustees desire staff collaboration in its current purpose to improve the organizational structure of the institution; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees, on the face of the record, appears not to have had called to its attention the Constitutional requirement in section xxii of the Governing Regulations of the University prescribed by the Board of Trustees that amendments can be made by the Board of Trustees only after notice shall have been given "to the President and Senate of the University when such amendments are under consideration by the Board of Trustees"; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees, the University administration, and the Senate have consistently observed the Board's Governing Regulations for the period of more than two decades since their adoption; and

WHEREAS, The resolution referred to seeks fundamentally to modify the functions of the University Senate; and

WHEREAS, President Cooper, following the tradition established by President McVey, has provided the Senate with able leadership which engaged the effective cooperation of this body and enabled it to contribute to the solution of problems facing the University during the academic year 1940-41, when the University faced the problems arising from the transition between University administrations and those created by the war abroad; and

WHEREAS, The Senate, under the Constitution and Governing Regulations of the University, has played an essential role in developing the institution; and

WHEREAS, The Senate serves as a body in which the professors of the University have become acquainted with the work and needs of the institution as a whole, its colleges and departments, and its administration, and serves as a body to which major University committees report and from which informed advice is obtained in matters of coordination within the University; and

WHEREAS, Without such a unifying agency as the Senate, the University will fall into uncoordinated divisions, and members of the faculty and the

student body will find their interests in the University as a whole discouraged; and

WHEREAS, The Senate believes that the best interests of the University, the citizens of the Commonwealth, and the requirements of economical administration which forbid the duplication of expensive services are best served by this democratic participation of officers of instruction in the guidance of educational policies of the University; and

WHEREAS, The Senate wishes to direct attention to the trend in American institutions of higher learning toward increased participation by the teaching and research staffs in the management of university affairs; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Senate respectfully petition the Board of Trustees for a reconsideration of its action of April 1 in so far as it affects the Senate and its powers, and be it further

Resolved, That the Secretary is hereby directed to forward to each member of the Board of Trustees a copy of this resolution."
