Find herewith, bill for judgment and costs in the case of O.A. Haggins vs. L & E Railway Co. in the Breathitt Circuit Court. The amount of the judgment is \$40.00 with interest from July 13, 1914. The costs altogether amount to \$47.55. Please refer to your letter to me of July 23, 1914 and my reply thereto of July 27, 1914 with reference to this case.
