✓ Frank Blair vs/ L & E. Ry. Co., set for the 11th day of the term, 21st day of the month. *(Cow case)*

We will want Mr. Hardesty to be here and we also want as witnesses, J.A. Blanton, Eng., Acy Mize, Firmean, and R. Short, Cond. This action as you will remember was for killing a cow near Mayking, Ky., and the case was tried in the Quarterly Court. No one saw this cow killed except your train crew, and from their statement, we certainly ought to win. Mr. Hardesty put the limit at \$50.00, in this case, and no settlement could be made for that, and the judgment in the lower court was \$63.50. We will depend on you to make the request for these witnesses as we have no blank forms here.

The case of K.S. Potter, &c., vs. L & E. Ry. Co., is set for the 19th day of the term, 31st day of the month, you know about this case.

Wesley Caudill vs, L & E. Ry. Co., set for the 19th day of the term, 31st day of the month.

✓ F. G. Fields vs. L & E. Ry. Co., set for the 19th day of the term, 31st day of the month. This case is for killing some bird dogs and a hog.

n Thos. Hall vs. L & E. Ry. Co., set for the 21st day of the term.

The above are all the cases that have been set for trial. You will know from your file, that the Wesley Caudill, E. H. Combs and Thos. Hall case are for damages to realty. *(All answers prepared.)*

We have no file of the F.G. Fields case, for the killing of the dogs and the hog.

* You had better furnish a man for us, to assist in getting in the witnesses in these cases, these cases are set as you will observe for the third week of the term and it will not be necessary for you to come up until a day or two before the cases are set down for trial, still we would like for you to come and be with us before that time, to talk the cases over, if you hve time to do so.
