In re Crawford vs. L. & E. Railway Co.

My dear Judge:-

I am obliged for your favor of the 17th inst., advising that you can take up the motion for a new trial in the Crawford case on Saturday.

I at once wrote to Mr. McDaniel sending him a copy of the amended motion and of two of the affidavits and wrote Mr. Hurst to procure several other affidavits and furnish me copies of those at once.

I have been a little dilatory about preparing for this motion owing to the delay of Mr. Hurst in getting two or three affidavits about some newly discovered evidence. I said to Mr. McDaniel that in view of the fact that he would have very little to rebut the evidence I would not insist on the hearing Saturday if he desired any more time than this arrangement gave him, but I have heard nothing further from him.
