

I return invoice of the Westerfield-Bonte Company covering the printing of brief in suit of Court of Appeals in connection with the litigation growing out of the Jones Brothers' work on the North Fork Extension.

It is the purpose of this Company to bring suit against Jones Brothers and their bondsmen for three distinct items.

let - Covering the cost to this Company of completing the work under their contract,

2nd - Covering the cost to this Company for defending suits in I tigation growing out of personal injury and damage claims in connection with their work, and

3rd - For Defending lien suits brought against this Company for amounts owing outside parties by Jones Brothers.

We already have the cost for completing the work of Jones Brothers set up in a separate account, known as the "Jones Brothers' Account", and while the account govering the account item has not been set up separately, it can readily be ascertained from the books of this Company just what items it would cover, and as there will be a great number of claims to defend under the third heading, I would suggest that a Suspense Account be opened on your books to be known as "Jones Brothers bien Litigation", and that all items growing out of lien claims, of which there are upwards of 1,200, be charged to this Account, so that the amount of our claim against Jones Brothers and their bondsmen on this account can be readily ascertained at all times; and should we not be able to collect from Jones Brothers and their bondsmen for amounts expended under this heading, we can later close this account into the regular Construction Account, but I do not think we should do so until after it has been definitely determined that we cannot recover the same from Jones Brothers and their bondsmen.
