Gentlemen:-

I acknowledge yours of the 12th instant, transmitting your file in the case of Susan Cornett v. L & E Ry. Co., and also file in the case of Wesley Caudill v. L & E and L & N. The Susan Cornett file contains a copy of the Petition in her original suit against the Company and Adams & Sullivan, etc., which is what I particularly wanted.

I do not understand just why you sent me the Caudill file, as I do not recall having written for it and my recollection is that this suit was dismissed by Mr. Hays or, at the last term of court, was left in a condition where a dismissal seemed inevitable. You may remember that the court refused to permit him to file an Amended Petition in this case in which the plaintiff sought to join his wife, Mahala Caudill, as a co-plaintiff with him. This amendment was tendered September 2, 1914, and refused. Kindly drop me a line, indicating for what purpose the Caudill file was sent and oblige,
